

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 am by President Krista Lopez at the Covenant Presbyterian Church in Napa, CA.

The minutes of the November meeting were approved as they appeared on the website.

December birthdays were acknowledged and Happy Birthday sung.

It was noted that the money deposited to the Guild account for the retreat 2016 in \$6,701.00. This leaves our actual balance at \$8,686.17.

Programs: Sue Moore thanked everyone for her past year as vice president and said she had a blast. In January, the program will be Sherry Werum from Woodland, California, who will be teaching a table runner class. There are still openings for this class. It will be held on January 10, at the Napa Mobile Home Park on Orchard Avenue. The table runner is partly woven with fabric, and can be completed in the class time. The cost for the class is \$20, and there are also complete kits available for \$35. See Leslie Vaughn or Sharon Templeton to sign up. In April, there will also be a table runner class taught by Joy Lily. Sharon Templeton announced that she has the instructions for the "Once Upon a Nine Patch" program, in which members will create nine-patch quilts. She also has books available to purchase about the half log cabin method Linda Wagner spoke about at the last Guild meeting.

Membership: Anna MacCallen reports 87 members present today, as well as two guests. Don't forget that 2016 dues are now due. There are envelopes available for paying your dues. Please pay now to ensure you will be included in the 2016 Guild Roster. President Krista added that next year, there will be a \$10 charge for those members who want the newsletter mailed to them. She also reports we are working on getting the email issue with Mail Chimp resolved.

Sharon Templeton thanked the outgoing board members, Sue Moore and Denise Callahan, for their service to the Guild, and presented them each with flowers. Quilts to Share: Sue Lipschultz reports we will be distributing our quilts next week. We have less quilts to give out this year due to the many quilts we gave to the Valley Fire victims. Pillowcases will also be distributed, and we have had good response to the pillowcases.

Quilt Show: Rose Luce reports the Quilt Show is in the preplanning stages and there will be more information about it coming in January. She will be asking for volunteers and committee chair people.

President Krista read a thank you letter to the Guild from one of the people who distributed our quilts to the Valley Fire victims.

NVQ January BOM ~ Crazy Arrows

Piece A – Any fabric cut one strip 3 7/8" by 32"

Piece B - White on white, white, light beige cut one strip 3 7/8" by 32"

* 11

Stack fabric A and B strips right sides together and all edges aligned. Cut fabric into 8


3 7/8" squares.


Mark the square diagonally then sew ¼' above and below the marked line then cut a part on marked line.

Piece your squares in the order shown at right.

Press seams in alternating directions by row.

Finished block approx 12 % "


