

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



19th Sunday Ordinary Year B

Is geography destiny? Some people say, "We are, where we live." Certainly, our environment helps to form us. I can think of the roots of the concept of 'Southern Hospitality', stemming from how warmer weather drew everyone to sit out on their front porch in their swings or rocking chairs to either greet <u>every</u> walking passerby, or <u>invite them up to sit</u> and have lemonade or tea. Certainly, it at least meant greeting and conversing with everyone along the walk, always using proper manners and maybe even offering food and drink to everyone ('Miss, bring your young-uns over here and come rest your feet'). While such 'formational effects' of our environment are not automatic, they do influence us. Yet, they can also easily lead to stereotypes and bias, too, reflected in such belittling comments as 'Stay away from them, they live on the 'other side of the tracks', or 'Be careful, he is from the 'east side'.

There is an element of such '*zip code' prejudice*, in today's gospel against Jesus due to the supposed knowledge of Jesus' roots ('Is he not the son of Jospeh and Mary?'-Jn 6:42) John's gospel had reflected this sinful bias already back when Nathaniel received his call to become an apostle in John 1:46. When hearing that Jesus was from Nazareth, Nathaniel popped off, "*Can anything good come from Nazareth?*" But also, a lot of the error in our prejudices come from our own bull-headed arrogance of presuming to 'know everything'. Because '*they think they know'*, since they are aware what Jesus' parents' names were, knowing about his family and his upbringing, they feel justified in rejecting Him and His teaching. Contributing to their error of judgement, may have been a circulating tradition among Jewish elders that the Messiah would mysteriously appear out of nowhere, seemingly without local connections or pedigree. We hear about such a traditional expectation in John 7:27, when some Jerusalem residents sense Jesus is religiously special, but are troubled by the fact they know Jesus' background. They comment to each other, "*But we know where he is from. When the Messiah comes, <u>no one will know where he is from</u>." This expectation probably stems from the mysterious angelic figure of Melchizedek in the Old Testament, who Hebrews 7:3 describes as "<i>Without father, mother, or ancestry, without beginning of days or end of life, thus made to resemble the Son of God, he remains a priest forever.*" Therefore, some people automatically rejected Jesus and His teaching simply because they know His family background. We need to keep aware of such 'know it all' tendencies and biases, too. These prejudices may lead us to fail to recognize & accept Jesus' grace when He comes to us.

The words from Jesus that triggered their rejection of Him, based on claiming to know His upbringing, was His statement, "I am the bread of life come down from heaven" (John 6:41). They seem hung up due to a lack of imagination, assuming that Jesus was declaring His mailing address to be PO Box 1, Infinity, Heaven 31415-7777. Of course, that way of interpreting Jesus' words, is too concrete and earth-bounded a way to fully appreciate who Jesus is. He can be 'from heaven' and also be 'from Nazareth'. They are mistakenly claiming that since they know His parents Joseph & Mary, then Jesus cannot also have a 'heavenly origin'. Of course, such a misapplied literalism misses Jesus' point completely. Jesus doesn't mean that 'heaven' is His postal address. No, He is revealing His 'otherworldly' mission and message (one not experienced right here right now). Jesus indicates the same point, when He says to the crowd in Matthiew 8:20, "the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head" and in John 18:36, "My kingdom does not belong to this world." Our 'earthbound-material' mindedness leads us to miss Jesus' spiritual point, as if He is saying, "this bread I feed you with, which is my own life, is like no bread ever tasted on earth before." It comes to us 'from beyond'-'from God'. This 'higher interpretation' is what St Paul later describes as 'spiritual meaning' in 1 Corinthians 2:14 that "the natural person does not accept what pertains to the Spirit of God....and he cannot understand it, because it is judged spiritually." Basically, Jesus is telling us not to 'limit' His teaching to 'our-bound' categories. If we do, then we miss out. It is as if Jesus is saying, "We are not in Kansas anymore—we've been swept up by the Spirit to so much more meaning!" The Spirit stretches us, and adds so much to our understanding. We must be open to Jesus' Words and Spirit to have our concepts broadened to include this 'heavenly dimension' to all things. Jesus opens this higher plenitude of meaning when He counsels us about the coming "Spirit that will guide you into all Truth" (John 16:13). So, the crowd that rejects Jesus' teaching here is missing out on the revelation of the 'kingdom of heaven'. They are also missing out on 'relationship' to the person of their Savior, due to their 'earth-boundedness'. How do we overcome this material 'earth-bias' in our thinking that keeps us from following Jesus most faithfully? We must be open, pray and 'listen to the Father' (Jn 6:45) to hear Jesus on this level. And what might that special 'listening' result in, but the realization of 1) the common origin from God of us all, 2)the sustaining/unifying draw of us to one another, & 3) the purpose of our lives.
