Our last meeting was held on Thursday, June 14, 2018 from 6:30 - 8:30 pm at the Richland Library Sandhills (Village of Sandhills Shopping Center), 763 Fashion Drive, Columbia (NE). Business items:

- 1) Treasurer's Report:
 - a. Treasury balance was reported at the meeting. We had some small deposits for vendor tables this month.
 - b. Expenses this month = \$425.69 for table rental (Party Reflections) and \$320 for security (Richland County Sheriff's Department).
 - c. Pending expense for this month is \$1,000 for the SC NG Armory show venue.
 - d. Keep in mind that all the venue expenses (tables, security, and armory rental) will be shared by the IPMS chapter. Vendor table sales will also be split with them along with the raffle take. There will also be some shared registration / entry fees. This means that an accurate treasury balance will be reported in July after all the show income and expenses have been finalized.

Reminder: Club Annual Dues of \$12 per member for 2018 are due starting in January. Still \$12 for adults with no dues for juniors under 18 years old. New adult member dues are pro-rated at \$1 per month for the remainder of the calendar year, first month's meeting attendance excluded. Please see the treasurer, Ralph Nardone, if you need to pay your dues.

2) June Scale Model Mega-Show Report:

- a. We currently have 50 vendor tables reserved / sold. This is a "sell out." Well done, Tim Darrah! (Note to any potential vendors for 2019 – Reserve your space early to avoid disappointment.)
- b. Payments received this month for vendor tables will be reported at the meeting.
- c. We have paid in full the cost of renting 33, 8' tables for vendors. Tables will be delivered on Thursday, 21 June and picked up on Monday, 25 June.
- d. We have paid in full the cost of security for the show. We will have an armed RCSD deputy at the show for 8 hours on Saturday, 23 June.
- e. We have submitted the request for our insurance certificate from the AMPS Treasurer, Tom Faith.
- f. Our AMPS registration and scoring file has been setup and is ready to run. Anyone who is interested in assisting with data entry for registration and scoring should contact Mike Roof. If possible, you'll need to bring your WIFI capable laptop computer on Friday and Saturday.
- g. We will hold our "arts and crafts" meeting on Saturday, 16 June at Mike Roof's house. We need to construct a new Judges' Signup Board and assemble our special awards. Start time is 11:30 am.
- h. If anyone is interested in doing AMPS Judges' Certification Training, let Mike Roof know. We can conduct the seminar portion of the training on Saturday leaving the mentored judging sessions for the show. We can also conduct an abbreviated "refresher" training session on Saturday.
- i. We can conduct all of the AMPS Judges' training on Friday, 22 June after setting up the venue. However, you must let Mike know before then if you want to do this. If no one asks for the training in advance, we will not plan on presenting it.
- See below for the detailed show operations time schedule. Be sure to either write it down or print a copy.
- k. Raffle donations: All club members that are able are asked to consider making a donation to the show raffle. Kits, books, tools, etc., are needed, especially ARMOR RELATED modeling items. If you have any donations, you may bring them to the meeting or direct to the show. THANKS!
- **3)** Until further notice, we will now be meeting on the 2nd THURSDAY of each month at the Richland County Library Branch in the Village of Sandhill Mall.
 - We already have a reservation for the library meeting room, 6:30-8:30 pm on Thursday, 12 July.
- **4)** We took suggestions and discuss options for a place to go and eat dinner and hold our "meeting after the meeting." After a brief discussion, we decided on CiCi's Pizza.
- 5) The floor was opened for any new business:

- 6) After the business portion of the meeting, we held our usual **Show & Tell** of new builds and works-in-progress. We'll draw for the monthly raffle prize winner at the end of the meeting. Tentative Agenda, Regular Meeting, 12 July, 2018

Our next regular meeting will be held on THURSDAY, July 12, 2018, 6:30-8:30 pm, at the Richland County Library Branch, Village of Sandhill Mall, Columbia (SE).

Tentative Agenda Business items:

- 1) Treasurer's Report:
 - a. **Total Treasury** = To be Reviewed at the Meeting (total of Bank Balance + CoH + Deposits).
 - b. **Bank Balance** = \$4,959.34 with one pending deposit of \$773.17 for an expected bank balance total of \$5,732.51 by the end of the month.
 - c. **Cash on Hand** = To be reported by the treasurer.
 - d. **Income and Payments this Month** = The pending deposit is \$773.17 to be remitted by the IPMS chapter as reimbursement for their share of the June show's venue expenses and the AMPS share of event sponsorships.
 - e. Our June 2018 MEGA-Show netted a profit of \$841.03. In comparison, our 2017 show netted a profit of \$652.71. A full profit and loss statement (P&L) for the show can be found later in this newsletter.

Reminder: Club annual dues are due this month. Still \$12 for adults with no dues for juniors under 18 years old. New adult member dues are pro-rated at \$1 per month for the remainder of the calendar year, first month's meeting attendance excluded.

- 2) June Scale Model Mega-Show Report:
 - a. AMPS had 42 entrants and 96 works. This is right down the middle of our 5-year show averages. We were slightly down on models entered over last year (102 in 2017) but slightly up on the number of entrants (36 in 2017).

- b. We awarded 70 medals this year which was about 1.7 medals per entrant. Again, this is right on our 5-year average.
- c. There were a total of 11 shared registrations between the IPMS and AMPS sides of the show. Interestingly enough, we also had 10 shared entries last year between the AMPS and Flight Deck shows. However, IPMS had 307 models entered by 63 entrants which was about three times larger than the FD side of our 2017 show.
- d. The combined AMPS / IPMS contest numbers for the show were 114 individual / unique registrants with 403 models. Pretty good numbers of any one-day model show.
- e. We sold out all 50 of our vendor tables but had two no-shows on three tables. That means that on Saturday, we had 47 vendor tables filled. Again, very respectable numbers. Timmy sold out of tables early and maintained a "stand-by" list, so that when we did have the inevitable cancelation the week before the show, he was able to fill all five tables in about two days (at full price).
- f. The raffle was huge, and credit must go to all the AMPS members who stepped up in a major way to donate armor kits and items to make up for a serious deficiency in that area. All in all, we made about as much on the raffle as we could have hoped for. I'm not sure we could manage a raffle much larger than this year's.
- g. AMPS Judging was a major success this year. We got lots of good help from our out-of-town friends, and all of our club members not engaged in other support activities really stepped up, too. There were a few common issues with individual scores. Some of these issues can be attributed to the usual human errors, but, once again, we still had a couple of judges who just can't seem to get with the program. We'll discuss some of the most egregious issues.
- h. The food vendors both seemed to be big hits with our show patrons, and hopefully we'll get both back next year (or equally good replacements).
- i. Venue setup and tear down went about as smoothly as we could hope for. Everyone pitched in and worked continuously until the job was done! I don't recall looking around and seeing any "wall flowers." I'd like to point out that no one who showed up at the scheduled time on Friday was late! A handful of us got to the venue early (for reasons I'll discuss at the meeting), and since we were already there, we went ahead and started work. Kudos to everyone who was involved, though, on Friday and Saturday. You folks work like a well-oiled machine, and it's impressive to see just how well.
- j. We'll publish a full and detailed show report next month, but suffice it to say that this was another great show put on by a great bunch of guys and gals! AMPS Central SC rocks!
- 3) As we discovered after last year's show, the NG armory venue is in very high demand. If we want to host another show in 2019, and if we want to use the same venue again, we really need to reserve the armory ASAP.
 - a. Question: **Do we want to host a show in 2019?** We will discuss and vote on this issue this month.

If you can't make the meeting, send Mike Roof an email with your thoughts and

preferences. I will accept written absentee votes. I have to have something in writing from you, though. I'll be happy to discuss the question with you on the phone, but we need to keep things above board. A written record of the votes is necessary in the (unlikely) event the question is more contentious than it seems.

- b. Related question: If we do decide to host a show in 2019, do we want to invite the IPMS chapter to co-host again? We will discuss and vote on this issue this month.
- c. Further related question: If we do decide to host a show in 2019, with or without the IPMS chapter, do we want to invite the SCMA chapter to co-host with us? We will discuss and vote on this issue this month.
- **4)** We will be participating in the 2018 Toy Soldier Show at the SC State Museum on Saturday, 11 August. This will be a joint scale model club display with the IPMS club and (tentatively) the SCMA club. We will be in the same general location in the mezzanine where we were last year.
 - a. Question: Do we want to try to organize some sort of display theme? If yes, what?

Also, we have the opportunity this year to expand our static display to include some active model building / finishing demonstrations. Ideas floated are folks building models (any subjects or scales), figure painting, model painting, model kit examples displayed, etc. We can get round tables from the museum and put them in the corner between the club displays.

- b. Question: **Do we have any volunteers interested in doing this?** You would have to bring your own supplies, etc. The club can provide the desk lamps that we use for judging along with power cords, etc.
- 5) Floor will be open for New Business.
- 6) After the business portion of the meeting, we'll **Show & Tell** of new builds and works-in-progress. We'll also draw for the monthly raffle prize winner at the end of the meeting. See Ralph, our treasurer, for raffle tickets at any time during the meeting.
- 7) After the meeting, everyone is invited to join us for the "meeting after the meeting" in which this month we'll explore some new ground! As mentioned in the June meeting minutes, last month we went to CiCi's Pizza which was OK, but not really suitable (crowded, chaotic, and filled to the brim with teenaged angst and tensions). Consider ahead of time where you might like to go this month and we'll discuss some new options.



Interesting Articles – Another AMPS Show in 2019?

An Editorial from Our Chapter Contact: Another AMPS Show in 2019?

I'm pretty sure that those of you who know me can already guess that I'm all for doing another show next year. Yeah, it is a lot of work (a LOT of work!), but I actually enjoy most of that. No kidding. I really do enjoy the time I spend with you, my friends, doing something together even if it's putting tables up and then taking them down. I enjoy the time I spend with you in the judging pits looking at and talking about models. I enjoy, appreciate and share your excitement when you find that perfect kit at the vendors or win a ton of prizes at the raffle. And I enjoy sharing your happiness and pride when you earn the recognition of your skills by your peers and are awarded a medal or two to show for it. The bottom line is that my attraction to model shows is mainly social. However, I also enjoy the opportunity to put my models on display. Oh sure, my family and non-model building friends are always polite when they "ooh and ahh" over some latest work, but let's face it, nobody appreciates our models like other modelers. And there's no better place to put your models on display for other modelers than at a model show where you're surrounded by likeminded folks who share your model building passions.

As your chapter contact, I see great value in the way hosting a model show draws the members of our club together and helps to cement the individuals in the group into a whole. The bonding experience that comes from working together to put on a successful show lasts a lot longer than just over a weekend, too. Throughout the year it contributes to making the individuals in the group more comfortable and open with each other which leads to a greater willingness to share and to reach out to one another about anything to do with modeling. The ultimate result is that as a

group our modeling skills improve at a faster rate. Working together to put on a model show brings us all closer to each other, and that close association with other modelers helps make us all better modelers.

Hosting a model show also forges a stronger connection with the wider model building community. Just as we bond with each other in our club and become better modelers with the experience, when we host others from the broader modeling community, we also bond with them and grow better. If for no other reason than we like to travel to model shows hosted by others, hosting our own shows gives us the opportunity to pay them back for their hospitality. By becoming engaged in the larger modeling world, we also establish a legitimate place for ourselves as part of that world. We move out of the shadows and away from being nameless and faceless modelers to becoming recognized and respected for the roll we play in our modeling community.

Of course, there are the financial aspects of running a successful show. Our shows are our club's main source of operating revenue. In all honesty, though, the money side of our shows is not all that important. We could easily get by financially without any annual show income. We'd probably have to scale back our website, but that's it really. We don't have to host model shows because we somehow couldn't get by without the money. Actually, our biggest annual expense is... our model show. If we didn't run a show, we wouldn't really need the money we earn from running a show.

Yeah, I know there are some out there who insist that model clubs and, by extension, model shows need to be run like businesses. You know, I do get that, but I think it only applies up to a point. The bottom line is that we, AMPS Central SC "Wildcats," don't just host successful shows, we host darned profitable ones, too! We've never even come close to going in the red on one of our shows, and I don't have any concerns about that. Yeah, our club's a "business," but it ain't Wall Street.

Still our show profits have allowed us to donate more than \$1,000 over the past two years to the National Armor and Cavalry Museum's building fund. This is another example of how hosting a show allows us to give back to the modeling community while cementing our place in that same community. (There're not many – actually none that I know of – other AMPS clubs that have donated so much to the NACM. You guys have earned the bragging rights to that!) Making money on hosting shows does create opportunities for us, and it does allow us to run our website like we want, but it's not critical to our existence as a club. The profit mostly just allows us to give back more to the modeling community.

On the related questions about inviting the other scale modeling clubs in our area to co-host with us, I'm also firmly in the "yes" column.

This year with the IPMS/Mid-Carolina "Swamp Foxes" chapter, we hosted what is arguably our most successful show ever. On the money side, we netted about as much profit as we ever have, and on the participation side, when combined with the IPMS chapter, we had more entrants and models than ever. The combined show also made soliciting vendors much easier, and selling out the vendor tables went a very long way to paying for the venue (which in turn contributed to our tidy little profit). As a practical matter, two clubs made setup and tear down easier, and the raffle was just that much bigger (which again contributed to a higher than usual profit).

But more importantly, co-hosting the show made a major impact on the broader regional modeling community than just hosting by ourselves. It demonstrated that AMPS and IPMS can work together to everyone's benefit. So, do we NEED IPMS to co-host with us? No, not at all. As we

have demonstrated again and again, year in and year out, our chapter can host successful and profitable shows on our own. It's not about "need," though. It's about "should" and doing the right thing by the modeling community in our area. We should invite the IPMS chapter because that's the right thing to do.

I believe that one of the reasons why this year's show was so successful is that there was an unfulfilled demand in our area for a large, all genres and subjects scale model show. We, AMPS Central SC, are in a unique position to meet that need again next year if we invite our IPMS friends to co-host with us. This is not to say that the IPMS club couldn't do it on their own (or, for that matter, that AMPS couldn't do it on our own like we did last year), but that we have the momentum and experience to take the lead on doing it. There has been a lot of bad blood towards AMPS in IPMS Region-12, and we, AMPS Central SC, can take the high road and help put that to rest. We and our IPMS/Mid-Carolina friends are better than that, and together our two clubs can set the example. Our success together is the strongest answer to the IPMS R-12 AMPS critics.

Furthermore, we also have a unique opportunity in 2019 to include the local SCMA chapter in our invitation. Again, doing so puts AMPS in a "lead by example" position with the broader modeling community, and it also gives us a chance to pay back a debt we owe the SCMA folks for allowing us to co-host our first shows with them. The local SCMA chapter has been through some rocky times over the past year or so, and now as they're getting their feet back on the ground, it's time for us to reach out with a helping hand to them.

So, there you have it. When it comes to the question of should we host another show in 2019, my unqualified answer is, "YES!" Should we also invite the IPMS and SCMA clubs to co-host? Again, my vote is "yes." But, this is not my club, it's OUR CLUB. Everyone's opinion counts, and if the group consensus is "no," then so be it.

You guys and gals give all this some thought for our next meeting.




