A Well-Lived Life of Service



On November 27, 2022 Crescent Hills lost one of its own. Nicholas Theofilis, died on the job, driving a Penn Hills EMS Ambulance, when his vehicle was struck in a horrible accident.

Nick was an exceptional young man who grew up on Crescent Hills Road. A 2017 graduate of Penn Hills High School he was a member of the Naval ROTC. He started his EMT training in high school and finished with the rank of Paramedic. He served as a Paramedic for both Penn Hills and White Oak, and was a volunteer firefighter for Rosedale Fire Department No. 222 in Penn Hills. He was a boy scout, and attained the rank of Eagle Scout. He was a Certified Lifeguard, CPR Instructor and was a Freemason, a member of Infinity Lodge No. 546 in Penn Hills.

Nick had a large presence, a great heart and was always willing to help. He was fun to be around but was also mature way beyond his years. He loved his community and was constantly overcommitted in all the service activities he could handle. He died a hero, on the job serving his community. He was our hero and we will miss him dearly.

His funeral was a fitting tribute to the young man who exemplified service over self. Pittsburgh's Bishop David A. Zubik was among those who eulogized Nick, along with Mayor Pauline Calabrese. Every corner of our district and beyond was blocked off for the funeral motorcade which had seemingly every form of emergency vehicle in the area rolling down. People came out of their homes, businesses and out of their cars to pay their respects and many saluted each and every vehicle.

A Penn Hills Ambulance served as the hearse and what started as a gloomy, rainy day ended with the majestic fluffy clouds parting to frame the sun shining a bright sunset orange over the Mt Hope Cemetery gravesite. A somber last dispatch call was sent out for Nick over loudspeaker. It ended with a helicopter flyover and a 21 gun salute. It has been said by many that "To know Nick was to love Nick." We love you Nick Theofilis. The entire community of Crescent Hills sends our deepest sympathy to Nick's parents and brother, Pete, Lori and Max Theofilis of Crescent Hills Road, and to his grandmothers, extended family, friends and colleagues.

Carnivores Sports bar in Oakmont added a Memorial plaque to the counter where Nick often sat. There will be a "A Nite for Nick" there on Friday, Jan 27th at 6PM, 215 Allegheny Ave. in Oakmont, PA. Please come out and celebrate his life. Nick would have been turning 24 on Jan 26th. 20% of food and alcohol sales and all raffle basket proceeds will go to his family.

Holiday Dinner Party

Fifty-two CHCA members and guests enjoyed greeting one another over cocktails followed by a delicious buffet style dinner complete with cake and a beautiful assortment of cookies. Park Report/News

Most of our work done in the park from Spring through Fall of 2022 was to improve safety and usage in the park:

- kids court was power washed to reduce slippery surface
- 10 yards of playground mulch were spread
- new dog bag boxes were placed
- 4 yards of garden mulch were placed
- garden annuals were planted

• 6 decaying trees along with other dangerous branches were removed.

The park is an asset to our community! It provides a place where we residents can play sports, have picnics and socialize. Having the park in our neighborhood improves the value of Crescent Hills homes, even if the house is located several streets away from it and even if the owner doesn't use the park. But even with volunteer help, it costs a lot to maintain! These are examples of 2022 expenses:

- Portapotty rental: \$856
- grass-cutting and leaf-gathering: \$3,310
- taxes: \$615
- liability insurance: \$412
- tree removal of decaying trees: \$4,650
- playground and garden mulch: \$400

So, even if no trees were removed, the Crescent Hills Park still needs \$5,600 minimum in donations to function yearly.

There is a strong possibility that Crescent Hills Park will be one of the recipients of "stimulus funds" (from the municipality that came from the federal government) given out in the next few months. Those funds can only be used toward new equipment or major improvement products. If it is awarded to the park, it would be used to repave the sports court and create drainage of that court. This money is not allowed to be used for maintenance.

Many of the Crescent Hills neighbors see volunteers like me raking, spreading mulch, tending gardens and picking up debris on a daily basis. But we need to hire people like landscapers, tree removers and sanitation companies to do the more complicated work. This is a one-and-one-half-acre site that many people use, so it costs more to "keep up" than a homeowner's yard does.

Our neighborhood depends on residents like you to donate at least \$40 to the park towards these maintenance expenses of \$5,600. Won't you help?
