Doctor Feels Speechless About God's Providence

Nestled in the southern foothills of Guatemala City, lies the tiny little town of Quetzaltenago, which was home to Dr. Joel Lazo, his wife Dr. Elsa, and their three beautiful daughters --

Elsy Amarilis, 5; Lina Fernanda, 4; and Maria Laura, 3-until October of this past year, 2006.

Sometime mid summer, a friend of a friend of one of La Loma Luz's doctors, who is friends with Dr. Lazo, happened to be visiting in Guatemala City. He asked Dr. Lazo if he would ever consider moving. And Dr. Lazo said, "yes." The doctor said, "here," and he gave Dr. Lazo a piece of paper with Grant McPherson's name on it, and said, "Give this guy a call."

So, Dr. Lazo called Grant, administrator of La Loma Luz. They talked for nearly an hour. Several times Grant tried to get Dr. Lazo to hang up and let him call him back so he wouldn't have to pay so much for the call, but Dr. Lazo just kept saying, "No, no, no!" and kept on talking.

They talked all about Dr. Lazo's educational background – graduating in 1995 from the University of

San Carlos, in Guatemala City and obtaining his OB/GYN specialty in 1999 from Hospital Regional de Occidente. They also talked about the fact that he and his wife had opened a clinic of their own in Quetzaltenago, in 1999. Then in 2000, he also worked at a hospital in San Marcos. From 2001 – 2003, they closed their clinic in order to work with INTERVIDA, which would go into the outlying villages and have clinics. In 2004, they reopened their clinic, and that is where contact with La Loma Luz began.

During that first phone call, after all the medical stuff was out of the way, Dr. Lazo, asked Grant about the working hours for the hospital, Grant had mentioned what they were earlier in the conversation, but he was now asking again. So Grant went over the hours again – Monday-Thursday 8-5 p.m. Friday – 8-3 p.m. Closed on Saturday and open Sundays 8-12. There was a long pause . . ., and Grant had to ask a couple times if he was still there before Dr. Lazo said, yes he was. Then he continued, "I just have to tell you the my wife and I attend the Iglesia Adventista. Then it was Grant's turn to be silent! Dr. Lazo said that he and his wife had been praying for a position in an Adventist hospital; La Loma Luz had been praying for an Adventist doctor!

Now that all this was on the table, work began in earnest to schedule an interview and get all the paperwork done. After making a few trips back and forth to Quetzaltenago, selling their practice, packing, (you know – everything that goes with a move!) they finally arrived on October 15. Well, now you have it! Our new doctor and his family – Drs. Joel and Elsa Lazo, and girls!

We wish to give the Lazo's our warmest (no pun intended) welcome, and we hope they have many years with us here at La Loma Luz.
