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I hope you have recovered from holiday festivities and are forging ahead into 2017 with renewed enthusiasm! Our 75th Anniversary Celebration at Lyn and John Pohlmann's home on December 4th was a delight, with scrumptious "high tea" sandwiches and petit fours preceding a performance by the Orpheus Duo (Althea Waites and Mark Uranker, faculty members at CSULB) on Lyn Pohlmann's two Fazioli grands. The performance included the premier of an arrangement of "*Herr, gehe nicht ins Gericht* from Bach's Cantata 105" for two pianos by Mark Uranker, which he dedicated to our MTAC Branch! Also included on the program were "En blanc et noir" by Debussy, "199" by Robin Cox, "Suite #2 from *The Three-Cornered Hat*" by De Falla (arranged by Mark Uranker, as well as an arrangement of "Ricercar a 6 from The Musical Offering" by Bach (arranged by Lloyd Rodgers). We enjoyed a slide show of photos from past MTAC-Long Beach events prepared by VP Marc Lombardino, and Secretary Gary Beaston provided CDs of 1940's big band music. Members enjoyed looking through old scrapbooks and yearbooks and sharing memories of MTAC events and members from long ago. A big **Thank You** to all who helped create this event and to all who attended!

The following weekend saw a nice turnout of participants in the Ensemble Festival, with students, family members, and teachers performing on piano, voice, and various percussion instruments.

Be sure to invite your students, family, and friends to the Wheeler Memorial Concert on Saturday, January 28 at 4 pm when several of our members will be performing to raise money for the Wheeler Memorial Scholarship we award to a graduating high school senior each spring. Last year we were able to award two \$500 scholarships! The concert helps us bring in funds for this worthy goal. This year the concert will be at Newcomb Academy, the new home of our branch's Mason and Hamlin piano.

Our Branch's Southern California Junior Bach Festival will be held the morning of February 11, and our Branch Baroque Festival will be the same afternoon, both at Newcomb Academy. Note that to register for the SCJBF you must go to <u>www.scjbf.org</u>, then to pay the fee go to our website at <u>www.mtaclb.com</u>. For the afternoon Baroque Festival register and pay on our website at <u>www.mtaclb.com</u>. The morning SCJBF event is designed mainly for pianists playing Bach, though others can enter (see rules on SCJBF website). Three adjudicators will evaluate students and choose those pianists who will be eligible to progress to the Winners' Concert. Entry fee is \$25 for the morning festival. The afternoon Baroque Festival is geared more towards vocalists and instrumentalists (other than pianists), and one adjudicator will select students to progress to the Winners' Concert. Pianists may enter the afternoon program for recital experience and comments, but they will not be eligible to progress to the Winners' Concert. Entry fee for the afternoon Baroque Festival is \$15.

CM teachers, don't forget to enter repertoire and schedule requests by January 15! If you have tried to enter schedule requests and were not able to select the day, try again now since the website has been updated to allow day selection.

Have you had fall or holiday recitals recently? Remember to send a copy of your program (hardcopy or email) to our ASCAP chair, Jennifer Watts, so ASCAP composers will be compensated for performances of their works! This is a wonderful program provided by the state MTAC office, and it costs us nothing other than postage to get the programs to the state office. Support your local compos-

er! (And chair Jennifer Watts is one – I saw on Facebook today that she has another new book just published by Hal Leonard! Congratulations, Jennifer!)


I hope you all have good health, happiness, and much music in 2017! Share your love of music with your students and all you meet to help bring beauty and joy to this world, which needs it so badly!

"Sounds of Nature" Theme Festival

The annual Theme and Styles Festivals have been combined this year and will take place on January 14. This year we will use the same theme as the State Convention Theme recitals: "Sounds of Nature." Vocal and instrumental solos and ensembles are invited; teachers are welcome to perform as well. Ardas Abad will be the adjudicator and will provide written comments (optional for teacher performers).

Deadline is currently set at January 4, but may be extended slightly to allow everyone to recover from the holidays. Entry fee is \$11. Teachers should collect all entry fees from their students and pay online when they register their students (parents/students should not pay online themselves since it makes it difficult to keep track of who has paid). Note that registration is not complete until the entry fees are paid.

Accompanist Fee Help

DID YOU KNOW?

Do you hesitate to enter students in our local events because of professional accompanist fees? Standing rule #13 states that "Accompanist fees for all recitals may be paid in part by the Branch. Each student is allowed fifteen dollars (\$15) per recital to a maximum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) per teacher per academic year. This fee cannot be paid for Certificate of Merit evaluations. Contact Treasurer Mary Inui if you wish to take advantage of this allowance.

January General Meeting: Voice Masterclass With Katharin Rundus

Our January Branch Meeting will be a voice masterclass conducted by Katherin Rundus, faculty member at CSULB and CSUF. The master class will be held at Sarah Sandvig's home at 3pm on Sunday, 1/22; contact Sarah or Marc Lombardino for more information or to see if space is still available for your student to perform.



Katharin Rundus is a nationally recognized teacher, conductor and singer. As a gifted soprano, Dr. Rundus has performed in opera, oratorio and musical theater productions in Italy, Germany, England as well as in the US. Recent solo performances include concerts at the Renee and Henry Segerstrom Concert Hall, Meng Hall at California State University, Fullerton, and the Corona Del Mar Baroque Festival.

In addition to her private studio at CSULB, Dr. Rundus is the

Director of Vocal Studies at Fullerton College, where she teaches voice and oversees the more than one-hundred-fifty students studying voice either privately or in classes. Her students at both institutions are consistent winners in competitions and auditions, and are performing and teaching all over the United States.

Dr. Rundus is frequently invited to lecture on vocal pedagogy at many universities, colleges and high schools, including UCLA and the University of North Dakota among others. She has been a featured clinician at many ACDA conferences, and has lectured about voice science to the NATS-LA chapter. She is the co-dean of Summer Sing, an annual singer's conference at Lake Tahoe, Nevada, where she is a favorite teacher of voice training, vocal health and choral pedagogy. *Cantabile: A Manual of Beautiful Singing* (Pavane Publishing), authored by Dr. Rundus, was published in 2009, and has become a popular and well-regarded textbook in vocal pedagogy.

Dr. Rundus received the Bachelor of Music degree from Coe College, the Master of Music degree from Westminster Choir College and the Doctor of Musical Arts from the Claremont Graduate University where she studied and researched the use of spectral analysis in the voice studio. Additionally, she has studied the science of vocal production with Ingo Titze and Katherine Verdolini at the National Center for Voice and Speech.


Harold Wheeler Memorial Concert and Scholarship Award


If you have a senior student who might be interested in applying for the scholarship this year, send application materials to Dolly Ickler by April 1. Applicants will be asked to submit a formal application, a recording of the student performing two works of contrasting styles, and two letters of recommendation, which cannot be from the current MTAC teacher or from any family member of the teacher or student.

The scholarship recipient is selected based on the following criteria:

"The student must have used his or her musical gifts to enhance the lives of others in the school and community. The student must have proved attributes that include good scholarship, musicianship, and industry." (From Branch Standing Rule #14b)


