We try to overcome this by explaining the handicap system, and how we have players of all abilities, and multiple flights in tournaments. We want the scratch golfers to have some stiff competition, and at the same time we don't want high handicappers to be intimidated or embarrassed. When you're talking to golfers somewhere else, please remind them that you don't need to be a stick to join the El Prado Men's Club, just enjoy a little completion and socializing.

The Associate Member Network has been a great success so far, with 6000 members – three times as many as the old e-club system. These golfers want to establish a handicap with SCGA, and choose a club close to home when they sign up. The local club can offer limited participation in club events. Did you know that El Prado has almost 100 Associate members? The question we are discussing is – why do these golfers want a handicap? Are they playing in other events? Or friendly matches with their buddies? Or maybe they just want to measure their improvement as they work on their game? Whatever the reason, as membership renewals become due in the next few months, we will invite associates to upgrade to full membership, so that they can participate in all of our events.

#### **Tournament News**

#### 2 Man 4 Club Red Tees Better Ball

Everyone seemed to enjoy the format again this year and the turnout of 75 players and was a bit better than last year. We had two man teams in four flights and used both courses. A&B were on Butterfield and C& D were on Chino Creek. The winning teams scored in the high 50's. Winners included the teams of Brian Dancses/Kirk Dancses in the A Flight with a score of 58. The B Flight with scores of 60 was a tie for first between the teams of Mike Sullivan/Gary Lovett and Troy Young/Larry Young. Winning C flight with a very low 57 was the team Eric Habermehl/Danny Ortiz. The D Flight winners were the team Marty Barreto/Lee Sherman 58.

The scorecards were kind of messy which was partly my fault for not setting them up better. The sideways labels did not help. The following are some of the audit results.

- I gave Steve Klepper 1 more stroke as the differential should have been 8 and he only got 7. Once applied, it did not make any difference in the outcome. I just wanted Steve to know I am on top of it.
- I DQ'd the team of Elliott/Nomura. The scorecard was not kept according to the Conditions of the Tournament. The marker failed to put down the gross scores of each player and it was not possible to correctly audit the scorecard. There was no change in the outcome as they were not in the running anyway. In this format it is OK to x out a hole but you still have to keep a gross score line for each player. Please note for future consideration.
- The team Briggle/Pirro had a final score or 65.
- The team of McLaren/Wallace had a final score of 63.

Note: I keep a picture of all scorecards so if you have a question please see me.

Thanks to Kevin for his support on the scoreboard and help with the results. When you talk with him please let him know how much we appreciate the help and support he gives to the El Prado Mens Club.

Your suggestions are always welcome. All ideas will be discussed and considered by the

EPMC Board and in consideration of the Golf Course as the case may be. We like to discuss new ideas and see if we can make them a part of our club and tournaments.

The Club Championship is our next tournament to be held September 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>. Our tournament year has been leading up to this one and, if you win, you carry the title and bragging rights for the entire year. Plus the low gross winner is entitled to go to the SCGA Tournament of Champions representing El Prado Mens Club with entry fee complements of the club. The low net flight champion will also be sponsored for entry by the club but will have to pay their own entry fees. Our 2016 El Prado Mens Club Champion was JP Iriart (71/71 142), and our lowest - low net flight champions was Larry LaBonte (68/69 137).

Eligibility: 3 Tournaments or 9 Skins games or a combination of both (3 skins = 1 tournament)

Reminders: The Club Championship is a two day event. I will only consider pairing requests on the first day. The second day pairings are set by your first day positions/ranking.

Tees: A Fit - Blue tees, B Fit - Blue/White tees, C & D Fit White tees.

Only all Blue Tees to be considered for the Gross Club Championship. (This option is open to anyone, just let me know ahead of time so I can set it up.)

Get your Club Championship entry in early in order to secure any tee time requests. I fill out the field and tee time requests based on first come first serve basis so please sign up early through e-mail to <a href="mailto:dcox181@hotmail.com">dcox181@hotmail.com</a> or by filling out a Sign-Up form located in the golf shop, in the newsletter, or online at our web site.

#### Jim Brown July 23, 1943 –August 8, 2017

So, we have lost one of our stalwart members. When the word spread that he had died in his sleep the responses echoed similar sentiments. "Good guy." "He will be missed."

Malarkey! He wasn't and he won't.

Jim Brown was one of the earliest members to join El Prado Men's Club. He even served on the board in one of the hardest and least appreciated positions: treasurer. He had steadfast loyalties. He was loyal to the club; he was loyal to the Las Vegas, and later, Laughlin Get-Away. And he was loyal to his friends, playing partners and family.

Jim never thought of playing anywhere except El Prado (other than the allowable discretion of You-the-Man). His attendance at every Get-Away was predictable, as was the annual poker game that followed the ceremonies. There is suspicion among some that that was the reason he played every year. The truth is that it wasn't because he was a great poker player (he was),



it was because he wanted to sit elbow to elbow with some of his best friends. And he occasionally took their money.



His loyalty never wavered. He willingly played with less popular players because they had no one else to play with. He once had a heart attack on the course during a tournament but finished the round so his partner wouldn't be disqualified. He was an Iron-Man. That was him on the course as well as his career.

Above all, he loved his family. He was thrilled when you asked because his grandkids' accomplishments were not short of remarkable.

At tournament check in, Jim was always a welcome contrast to usual stream of complaints. As everyone is trying to hurry the line along, Jim would not move on until you stopped whatever you were doing and said a proper good morning. He wanted to start the day off right by greeting his friends face to face, with a big smile and a firm handshake.

Jim was the kind of guy you would enjoy playing with every round. Friendly, encouraging and never surrendering to the bad swings or bad lies.

He wasn't a good guy.

He was a great guy.

And he will be **dearly** missed.
