## BILL TO REGULATE VEHICLES

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 23 MRSA $\S 2956$ is enacted to read:

## 2956. Use of motor vehicles on Monhegan Island

The Monhegan Island Plantation Board of Assessors may regulate the use of motor vehicles on roads on Monhegan Island. Any regulation of motor vehicles under this section must be approved by the voters of Monhegan Island Plantation. As used in this section, "motor vehicle" means a self-propelled vehicle not operated exclusively on railroad tracks except for a motorized wheelchair or an electric personal assistive mobility. device.

## SUMMARY

This bill allows the Monhegan Island Plantation Board of Assessors to regulate the use of motor vehicles on roads on Monhegan Island. Any regulation of motor vehicles must be approved by the voters of Monhegan Island Plantation.

## FIREWORKS ORDINANCES

A. Title

An Act to Control Fireworks on Monhegan Plantation

## B. Purpose

The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide for the general welfare, safe and healthful conditions, and to prevent injury and nuisance from the careless use of fireworks.
C. Conflict With Other Ordinances

This Ordinance shall not repeal, annul, or in any other way impair the necessity of compliance with any other rule, regulation, bylaw or provision of the Federal State or Local Government. In any conflict between this Ordinance and any other Ordinances, the stricter Ordinance, rule, regulation or bylaw shall control.
D. Validity and Severability

Should any section or provision of this ordinance be declared by the Courts to be invalid, such decision shall not invalidate any other section or provision of this Ordinance.
E. Effective Date

The effective date of this Ordinance is its date of XXX.

## F. Definitions

The following definitions shall apply in this Ordinance:

CONSUMER FIREWORKS--Consumer fireworks shall have the same meaning as in Title 27, Code of Federal Regulations. Section 555.11 or subsequent provision, but includes only products that are tested and certified by a 3rd-party testing laboratory as conforming with United States Consumer Product Safety Commission standards. in accordance with 15 United States Code. Chapter 47. "Consumer fireworks" does not include the following products:
1.i. Missile-type rockets. as defined by the State Fire Marshal by rule:
1.ii. Helicopters and aerial spinners, as defined by the State Fire Marshal by rule: and
1.iii. Sky rockets and bottle rockets. For purposes of this paragraph, "sky rockets and bottle rockets" means cylindrical tubes containing not more than 20 grams of chemical composition, as defined by the State Fire Marshal by rule, with a wooden stick attached for guidance and stability that rise into the air upon ignition and that may produce a burst of color or sound at or near the height of flight.

DISPLAY--Display means an entertainment feature where the public is admitted or permitted to view the display or discharge of fireworks or special effects.

## G. Prohibition

1. Prohibition against any use of Consumer Fireworks

No person shall use, display, throw, drop or cause to be discharged or exploded, any consumer fireworks or fireworks at any time.

## 2. All Other Fireworks

State law prohibits the sale and possession of all fireworks, with the exception of Consumer Fireworks. 8 M.R.S.A. §223.
H. Exception. This Ordinance does not apply to a person issued a fireworks display permit by the Plantation of Monhegan and/or the State of Maine pursuant to 8 M.R.S.A. §227-A. The Monhegan Fire Chief shall inspect the proposed display site at the time of the inspection conducted by a representative of the Maine Public Safety Department under 8 M.R.S.A. § 227-A (2). Additionally, consumer fireworks may used on July $4^{\text {th }}$ between nine am and ten pm .
I. Seizure and disposal of fireworks. The Plantation may order the Lincoln County Sherriff or another law enforcement official to seize consumer fireworks that the Plantation has probable cause to believe are used, possessed or sold in violation of this Ordinance and shall forfeit seized consumer fireworks to the State for disposal.
J. Violations and penalties.

Whoever violates any of the terms of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than $\$ 2,500$ for each offense, plus attorney's fees and costs. In all other respects, assessment of penalties under this Ordinance shall be in accordance with 30-A M.R.S.A. § 4452.
