FROM THE PASTOR

April 7, 2019
Fifth Sunday of Lent
Jn 8:1-11

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

"So what do you say?" (John 8:5) High drama in the temple! Jesus goes to teach at the Temple and walks into the middle of a trial! A woman is dragged into court. But who is really on trial? It sounds like Jesus is being put on the stand, because John 8:6 says, "They said this to test him, so that they could bring some charge against him." But since Jesus is the Wisdom of God Himself, He leads the Pharisees to cross-examine (& convict) their own selves. What are they really doing? They are protecting someone and selectively prosecuting someone else, with the purpose of entrapping Jesus, to charge him with committing some 'religious blasphemy' or 'Temple Violation'. *Jesus knows* what they are up to: He reads our hearts. In a similar confrontation from Matthew 9:4, the Bible says, "*Jesus knew what they were thinking.....*" Jesus knows our moral score inside and outside. One time when the Pharisees attacked Jesus' miraculous ability to exorcise & heal, they accused him of '*being possessed himself*'. He simply responded, "Then, by whom do your own people drive demons out? They will be your judges." (Matt 12:27). Judgment, like throwing rocks, is a tricky thing because it exposes our position. If we are in the right place, then fine. But if we are not safe on high ground, then we will be condemning ourselves. Jesus refers to this 'self-convicting' many times. He says in and Matthew 12:37, "By your words you will be acquitted, and by your words you will be condemned" and later still he says "Thus you bear witness against yourselves..." (Matthew 23:31). An old proverb among preachers is 'preach to yourself'. Or do you remember the old children's taunt "When you point a finger accusing someone else, three fingers point back at you!" The Pharisees are spotlighting their own hypocrisy by unjustly condemning this woman. So Jesus turns the trial back on to them. I find this chapter of John so interesting because of such reversals. Another flip-back is how the chapter begins with the woman almost being stoned to death, yet Jesus intervenes to defuse the situation. Such a reprieve from stone-throwing only lasts a little while, though. By the end of the chapter, the stones are being picked back up, to be hurled at Jesus! After the woman is saved, Jesus keeps on discussing with the Pharisees trying to bring them into the light of truth, but they only become more '*hardened*' in their positions. The chapter ends with them 'stone-attacking' Jesus. John 8:59 reads, "So they picked up stones to throw at him; but Jesus hid and went out of the temple area." Sticks and stones (*stuck in the mud and stone in hand!*)

But back to the beginning of this dramatic confrontation, I wonder if Jesus felt like saying, "Do you really want my judgment?" Have you ever been asked a question, and wondered, "Do you really want me to say it- really-what I think?" Well, after Jesus answers and based on the response of the crowd that they drop their stones, I think they regret asking Jesus for judgment. Between what he says, and what he writes on the ground, the crowd is exposed and realizes its own guilt. But, what about that gesture of Jesus writing in the sand? What is he tracing on the ground? Some have suggested that he is writing the name of the 'absent co-defendant'- (where is the man?-adultery takes two!). And maybe this missing man is a powerful person, chief rabbi or priest who may not like this crowd dragging him into this fight! Or was Jesus writing the names of everyone in the crowd with a quick note of their biggest sin? Or was Jesus taking a page out of the accused woman's black book, writing out a list of her past patrons? Whatever he wrote, it convinced (or convicted) the crowd to stand down, and drop their rocks. Speaking of the forgiveness of God for all who sincerely repent, I like to point out that Jesus was writing in sand. If he was listing sins, then also by the stroke of his hand, he can easily wipe them away-and thank God, He does just that! Hebrews 9:26 says Jesus "*takes away sin by his sacrifice*." (Also, John 1:29, says Jesus is the lamb of God who *takes away the sin of the world*.)

Jesus exposes the whole public show of hypocrisy and self-condemnation, when he summarizes this trial with the words, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." (John 8:7). This public shame could have been avoided had the crowd taken to heart his earlier teaching in Matthew 7:2, "For as you judge, so will you be judged, and the measure with which you measure will be measured out to you." A great Lenten meditation as we approach Holy Week!
