First, that the Presbytery meeting will go in our favor. Secondly, that we will be received; this will take lots of paper work and more meetings before we are released into ECO by our Presbytery.

I also want to invite you to my Wednesday night class during Simply Church. We are going to be watching a DVD series by John Wimber, the founder of the Vineyard movement. Happy New Year Trinity Family- Our God has used His mighty hand to provide abundantly for Trinity in 2015. At this time, all of our financial obligations have been met, and all of our Missionaries have been paid. We are currently working on the budget for 2016. Please join us in praying for God to reveal His financial vision for us in the coming year, and for showing us the amazing ways He plans to use His church on the hill. On behalf of the entire church leadership, I want to express appreciation for your generous and faithful support over the past year.

I am humbled to report that we have received \$32,870.00 towards the Discernment Gift Fund. This fund will remain open until January 31, 2016. After that, we will be making the final decisions on how to fund the balance of the \$75,000 buy-out for PCUSA. Thank you seems inadequate for how you continue to bless us in this Discernment process, and how God is providing for us.

Words from our Youth Director

For the month of December, Inside Out Youth Ministry played Bigger, Better, Best, which was also used to reach out to the community to inform them of our Christmas Eve Services. The students returned with some interesting items, including a ceramic clown, Espresso mug set, and an office chair. The students seemed to have a good time, but staff informed me that people in the community were not as willing or interested in participating in the game. We hope to explore our community further and

make some connections with people in 2016. As we neared Christmas, we played Russian Dodgeball in areas that got smaller with each round. We often talk about the nativity and wise men during Christmas, but we do not often think about the choice that God made at this very special and life altering moment- to confine Himself and His abilities to the tiny and helpless form of a baby. As we explored this idea, the students seemed to receive it well and think about this idea. Youth Ministry is taking a break for the remainder of the month due to family vacations and everyone needing some time off. As we look toward 2016, there are some events and plans that I hope we are able to accomplish, including a weekend conference for the students- Planet Wisdom, a 24hour Justice Experience at Church, and a week long San Diego Mission Trip through YouthWorks. Please pray for the students and staff as we plan these events and continue to work toward the students developing a deep and long term relationship with Jesus.

For the Love Thy Neighbor Project, December was a wonderful month for Outreach. We had people of all ages join us at Brighton Place, where we sang Christmas Carols and passed out handmade Christmas cards (Thank you Debbie White and Kids' Kingdom!!!). When I asked the supervisor if I could take pictures, she was hesitant. When I explained that we have many people in our church who would like to see what we do, she personally invited everyone to come and participate! (I decided not to take pictures- ha!) The residents were so thrilled to receive Christmas cards and, as we were walking out, we saw many of these residents lovingly holding and looking at the cards. What a blessing from such a small gift and

gesture. When the adults went downtown, the area of 16th and Island was the dirtiest that we had seen in a long time. Although we had several bags of donations, we decided not to hand them out due to the piles of clothes, blankets, food and trash that were lining the streets. We did hand out waters and donuts, and lots of prayer and conversation. Amidst the dirt and trash, we saw great acts of kindness among the homeless and many people wanting to visit with us. It was a very great time. Thank you for your continued donations to the homeless fund and donations of ponchos and warm clothes. I appreciate this church so much for your continued support of our group and the desire to help those who need some love.

MILITARY OUTREACH MINISTRIES

462 families received Thanksgiving meal boxes. Look on our website for photos of distribution: www.sandiegomom.org. In November 93 families took advantage of 5 regular monthly food ministries. 161 transactions were served through our distribution center which included 187 bags of diapers, 8 baby layette gift bags. Baby equipment, infant and children's clothing, children's toys and books were included, as were household items and miscellaneous goods that were given to junior enlisted families. An additional 12 families received household supplies through Command Partnerships.

SDMOM continues to have a successful collaboration with the Fleet & Family Support Center, Naval Base, San Diego for bread distribution who provided space in a garage and volunteers for several housing areas.

The Christmas Toy Stores for 2015 were at Point Loma Presbyterian Church, Graham Memorial in Coronado, La Jolla Presbyterian, Lakeside Presbyterian and the Taiwanese Church in La Mesa. We appreciate the donation of toys and money to provide the toys.

Please keep in mind the valuable services and support we provide to our active duty enlisted families: weekly bread distribution, monthly food distribution, dish packs and small household goods. We distribute new and like-new children's clothing, baby furniture such as, but not limited to strollers, high chairs and bouncers. We still give baby showers for new mothers for SDMOM and assist with Command baby showers.
