Len Horovitz, M.D., Chairman of the Medical Advisory Board (2009-2013)

Dr. Horowitz served as Chairman of the Medical Advisory Board from 2009-2013. He is Board-Certified in both Internal Medicine and Pulmonology. As a medical commentator, Dr. Horowitz appears frequently on national news and health networks. He is a featured expert medical commentator in Global Health institute's educational media productions (youtube: video "Pioneers in Integrative Healthcare"). He is a medical spokesperson for Lenox Hill Hospital (NYC), where he has been on staff for over thirty years. Dr. Horowitz graduated from Brown University (Phi Beta Kappa and *summa cum laude*) and from New York University School of Medicine. Dr. Horovitz is also the Director of Carnegie Medical PC and treats professional performers at Carnegie Hall, The MET OPERA, and on Broadway. He is an author of the medical anthology, "[The Singer's Guide to Complete Health](#)" (Oxford University Press, 2013).

Dr. Salvatore served as Chairman of the Medical Advisory Board from 2006-2009. Dr. Salvatore is a Board certified Urologist, a Member of the American College of Surgeons. Dr. Salvatore is a founding partner and Board member of Specialty Surgical Center. Dr. Salvatore attended Georgetown University School of Medicine and completed his residency at Tulane University where he was the Chief Resident in Urology. For the last ten years, Frank has dedicated himself to studying a number of different healing modalities and is working diligently to start an institute that will specialize in preventative and integrative medicine. Dr. Salvatore is trained in Chi Gong and has experienced many healing modalities.



John Edward Mack, M.D., Founding Chairman of the Medical Advisory Board (2004)

Dr. Mack was a professor of psychiatry at Harvard Medical School as well as a Pulitzer Prize-winning biographer. He founded the department of psychiatry of the Cambridge Hospital, the teaching hospital of Harvard Medical School. Dr Mack received his medical degree from the Harvard Medical School (Cum Laude, 1955) after undergraduate study at Oberlin (Phi Beta Kappa, 1951); a graduate of the Boston Psychoanalytic Society and Institute, and Board certified in child and adult psychoanalysis. Dr Mack embraced a worldview inspired by elements of spiritual and philosophical traditions which hold that we are all connected to one another. Dr Mack suggested that a materialist worldview was the root cause of long-simmering conflicts between the West and other cultures, and was responsible for the global ecological crisis. A shift in perspective was required, he suggested, to restore people's appreciation of connections to one another and to the natural world.
