Seeking Lay Leaders to Facilitate Health Promotion Workshops

(Duluth, MN) The Arrowhead Area Agency on Aging is seeking volunteers or professionals to become leaders in the evidence-based program Tai Ji Quan: Moving for Better Balance. People interested in volunteering to become a leader will receive up to 18 hours of classroom learning and direct experience with balance and strengthening exercises. Tai Ji Quan: Moving for Better Balance is an evidence-based balance training program designed for older adults and people with balance disorders. The program is designed to reduce the risk of falls by improving muscle strength, balance, flexibility, and mobility through low-impact movements. Exercises follow a progression of difficulty, from completely seated, through sit-and-stand, to chair-assisted, standing, and stepping.

The next training: Blue Cross Blue Shield Retail Center, 425 W. Superior Street, Duluth, MN, Thursday & Friday, September 14 & 15, 8:00 am-5:00 pm. Registrations will be accepted through August 14, 2017. The cost of the training is \$100; scholarships are available for those unable to pay and residing in the 7 county Arrowhead region.
