The host club event Chairperson, Club Governor, Host region RCD or NCCC VPS at the event may deny or remove any person demonstrating unsafe performance or actions at that event from participating in any events for the balance of the day or weekend. Further, if a person has previously been formally documented as behaving in an unsafe manner which could endanger them or anyone else at the event/s, that person may be denied participation.

Rules for “People’s Choice Judged” sanctioned event at Peers Auto Works June 15

1. Owner/Driver of the car should indicate participation in this sanction at the time of registration for the “People’s Choice NON-JUDGED” sanction/event. Participant will be handed judging sheets for the judge(s) to use.
2. NCCC points will be awarded separately from the “People’s Choice NON-JUDGED” sanction/event.
3. If an NCCC entrant has more than one car in the sanctioned event, he must declare which vehicle will be judged for points.
4. There is no additional cost to participate in the judged sanctioned event.
5. Cars will be parked with the “People’s Choice NON-JUDGED” cars.
6. This event is in effect a “LIMITED” NCCC Concours D’Elegance event.
7. No “Operations Check” will occur on the car.
8. There will be two awards per class.
9. The classes will be by generation (C1 through C7). NO Modified, Street Show, Wash & Show, Race Prepared, Custom classes.
10. The criteria for judging will be cleanliness and condition. Dust from the surrounding area that falls on the car will not count against the vehicle.
11. The judging guidelines are defined in sections 7.5 of the 2017-2018 NCCC competition manual (available online) given the limited nature of the sanctioned event.
12. The car should be opened up (doors, trunk/hatch, hood) and items removed from the floor area during judging to obtain full points for the area. If a judge cannot observe the judging area, all deductions for the area will occur.
13. The owner/driver/representative does NOT have to remain with the car but can give permission to a judge to open areas of the car that will be judged if not already open.
14. Convertibles tops should be UP during judging. It does not have to be “locked down” but in a position to have a judge examine condition and cleanliness.
15. T-tops and coupe tops should be on the vehicle.
16. The glove box and consoles do not have to be emptied as they will not be judged.
17. Floor mats do not have to be removed but the area should be clean and clear to obtain full points
18. The areas of the vehicle that will be judged will be exterior, interior and engine compartment.
19. A maximum number of 75 points in deductions can occur based on sections 7.11, 7.12 & 7.13 of the NCCC competition manual.
20. Points will be based on the NCCC Competition Manual Concours Prepared Judging sheets. An additional ½ point (each) can be gained by having the following safety/documentation items available within the display: Sticker, Build Sheet, Story-board on the car, Toolkit and/or Tow Strap, First Aid Kit, Fire Extinguisher. (A maximum of 3 additional points can be obtained to the above judging guidelines)
21. For fairness, cleaning of the car can occur up until the time the first car in the class starts to be judged.
22. Judging will start after the Drivers’ Meeting. Place judging sheets on the dash when the car is ready to be judged.
23. One or more judges will judge an entire class (generation) for consistency.
24. Decision of the judge(s) of each class is(are) final. All parties involved in disagreements as to classification, judging, or tabulation will conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner at all times.
25. There will be no required signature by the owner/driver after judging occurs.
26. If the owner/driver wants to know the areas of deductions during judging, he/she should contact the judge sometime during the day. An appropriate time to go over the deductions will be agreed upon that does not interfere with the overall show event for the day. That meeting time may or may not occur on the day of the event.
