A WARM WELCOME FOR ALL

Welcome to the Willette church of Christ, where you will find the Bible as our only rule for faith and practice. We seek to speak where the Bible speaks and to be silent where the Bible is silent. We want to call Bible things by Bible names and do Bible things in Bible ways.

Jesus said, "Go ve therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost" (Matthew 28:18-20). Our evangelistic efforts include several local and foreign mission works listed on the back of this bulletin. The home congregation is the most important work. Tidings from Timothy

If God wanted to emphasize something, what would He do? Would he put it in the Bible in ALL CAPS? No, because the earliest manuscripts we have in the Greek, for example, are already in all-caps. Would He put it in **bold?** No, since they just didn't do that, and they didn't have typewriters back then anyway. Did he say things like, "Let me shout this out loud!", using a lot of exclamation marks or *italics?* No, not that either. God emphasized something in the Bible by *REPEATING* it. This morning we will see how the plan of salvation is played out in example so many times in the Bible that there is no way to miss it.

The individual how was perhaps once very religious, but now not so much, the person who once at least visited regularly but now does not, the person who once volunteered to do a lot in the church, but now is very luke-warm at best: These and those who have just gone into full apostacy are those we are targeting in this Meeting. The elders want you to give them names that we can focus on by making MULTIPLE visits to each one of them and giving our best effort to revive the soul. Will you help in this? Who in your family needs revival? Who among you coworkers has visited us in the past, but stopped. They simple don't seem as interested anymore. Who was a member in good standing but now seems aimless in life? Pray about these people and get them to come at least once to the Meeting – we can help! Just give us the name and our prayers and visits will join in with yours and we will have the best Meeting ever.

<u>National Door Knock Day:</u> We are going to have a special day of making several hundred visits in conjunction with many, many other congregations across the country on October 5. Please make plans to give a portion of your day to help us get the word out about the church on 10-05!

I am scheduled to be in a Meeting at Flat Rock church of Christ September 8-11. Moss church is having a Meeting with Jack September 29th – Oct. 2nd.

"But They'll get Mad!"

Generally speaking, there are only two reactions to truth. People will either accept it or reject it. The hard sayings are what really separate true believers from the unconverted. When Jesus taught that he is the bread of life many were offended at this (John 6:48-61). Jesus knew in himself that men would reject this because he knows what is in man (John 2:25; 6:61). What

is sad is that many of his disciples "went back, and walked no more with him" (John 6:66). Suppose one of the disciples had cautioned Jesus not to teach these things. We can almost hear on saying, "But they'll get mad!" Would that have stopped the Lord from so speaking? No. The truth is what men need to hear, believe and obey to be saved (John 8:31,32). Jesus loved us enough even to speak the hard sayings.

Man's reaction to truth says a lot about him. One who rejects the hard sayings is not truly converted to the Lord's way. Hear what the Bible says: "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths. Be not wise in thine own eyes; fear the Lord, and depart from evil" (Prov. 3:5-7). When one accepts only the easy sayings of Jesus he is leaning on his own understanding. Whoever rejects the hard sayings is headed for destruction because of his foolishness. "The ear that heareth the reproof of life abideth among the wise. He that refuseth instruction despiseth his own soul" (Prov. 15:31,32). He is like the son who would not be warned of the dangers of a loose woman. He cried out in misery "How have I hated instruction... and have not obeyed the voice of my teachers" (Prov. 5:12,13).

Think about the person who advises another not to teach the "controversial" subjects of the Bible. When one says, "But they'll get mad," is this merely stating the obvious? Is it possible that such comments are urging an avoidance of "touchy" matters? If so, this amounts to not trusting the Lord with ALL one's heart. Though Jesus' teaching was offensive to many that day, the apostles continued to walk with Jesus. Jesus tested their commitment by asking the twelve, "Will ye also go away?" (John 6:67). Peter's answer ought to characterize us as well: "Lord, to whom shall we go? thou hast the words of eternal life. And we believe and are sure that thou art that Christ, the Son of the living God" (John 6:68,69). Though Peter later denied even knowing the Lord because of fear, he repented and returned to the only source of eternal life.

Let us also resolve to be true followers of ALL that Jesus taught. If we have trouble accepting the difficulties of the Christian life let us remember what Jesus endured for us on the cross. Then, call to mind the words of our Savior when he told us, "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me" (Luke 9:23). This is a hard saying for many people, but those who get mad and reject it will reject eternal life. Jesus became mankind's greatest friend by laying down his life for us. Should not we humbly submit to his commandments even if it means suffering "light affliction, which is but for a moment" (II Cor. 4:17)?
