The Reverend's Ruminations - December 2022

But the first Sunday of Advent has just passed, signifying a "new beginning" in the life of the church the beginning of a <u>new</u> liturgical season and a new church year. You may have plenty to do before January 1st arrives and begins a new calendar year, but in the Christian church we're already on our way! This year (Year A in the three-year lectionary calendar cycle that helps guide us through the church seasons) I plan to start preaching from the Old Testament lessons, after spending the last three years preaching from the Epistle lessons (and before that, the Gospels). It may prove challenging, but "new beginnings" have to start somewhere, and the story of our modern Christian faith obviously begins with the faith and writings of our Hebrew ancestors.

You're likely familiar with the fact that, during the Advent season, we frequently draw connections between the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ and the prophecies of a coming messiah recorded in the Old Testament. During December and most of January, the passages will be from the prophet Isaiah, highlighting the "new beginnings" long interpreted to be speaking directly of Jesus and his ministries. Most of them are voiced in future tense, predicting not only the birth of a tender babe, but "new beginnings" in nature, kingdoms, countries, and the broader world. For example, Isaiah 35:1-2 says, "The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing." Isaiah 49:7 predicts, "...Kings shall see and stand up, princes, and they shall prostrate themselves, because of the Lord, who is faithful, the Holy One of Israel, who has chosen you." And Isaiah 42:8-9 proclaims, "I am the Lord, that is my name; my glory I give to no other, nor my praise to idols. See, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth, I tell you of them."

As you prepare for Christmas this year, will everything about your decorating, meal, and gathering be exactly like it has been for years (or just like your parents or grandparents always did)? Or will there be a few "new beginnings" of your own as you celebrate Christ's birth this year? Traditions do help us remain connected to the past, but as our journey continues, don't be afraid of the newness that presents itself like a fresh coat of snow!

Of course those new beginnings will more likely be on your mind *next* month, as we roll into a new year and the ubiquitous resolutions that seem required conversation everywhere you turn. But new beginnings come in many shapes and sizes, and nowhere has that been more apparent to me lately than in the celebration of our daughter Emma's wedding. Talk about a time of new beginnings!?! Those of you who are (or were) married for many years remember well the newness of those first months and years with your spouse: new names, new family members, new bank accounts, new apartments, and new responsibilities to someone besides yourself. With all the "new" comes "old" traditions from each other's families, as well as blessings too numerable to count, and adventures that will form the cornerstone of their life together.

As 2022 does in fact wind to a close, let us celebrate the year we've shared together, giving God the glory for all we have done. 2023 is just around the corner, and we have the opportunity to continue serving our great God together. Alleluia!

The Council met in the Fireside Room at 5:45 PM. The meeting was called to order and led in prayer by Moderator Abigail Anderson. Minutes from the Oct. 19 meeting were approved as printed. Motion M/S/C (Cathy/Dave).

Treasurer's Report: Catherine Johnson reported that 75% of income has been received, and the year is 80% through. She thanked Hospitality for their Harvest Festival fundraising. Around \$1200 was raised. Preparations for the Budget Meeting are going well.

Payroll Tax Rebate: Dara had this brought to her attention by Dave M/Bank Midwest. Dara will call our bank to check on this.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Cory was absent. We were able to read his highlights for the month.

HyVee & Fareway Receipts Report as of 20 November 2022

During the last five weeks \$13,950.77 (9.30%) worth of Hy-Vee slips were received. After 31 weeks, Hy-Vee is at \$125,067.85 (83.38%) toward the 15^{th} \$150,000 goal. There is a good chance that the \$150,000 goal will be met yet this year.

During the same five weeks, 3,038.36 (2.03%) worth of Fareway slips were received. After 98 weeks, Fareway is at 126,958.63 (84.64%) toward our 4th 150,000 goal. It will still take about 18 weeks to reach the 150,000.

This program started the first of March 2011, so any slips from then until now can be used. Any Fairmont Fareway and Hy-Vee food store register slip can be used. Even slips from Hy-Vee Gas, Coffee Shop, Food Service, and Pharmacy help us toward the goal. Thanks to all who bring/mail the slips to the Church, or mailing them or dropping them off at my house. Even the very small amounts help.






December 28: School Sunday Fun Night








MISSION MINUTE

December can be a busy time! Here are two similar recipes that will hopefully save you some time for more important things this month. One recipe is for when you need something on the table quicky, and one is for when you want to start supper and leave to do other things for the day. These have been taste-tested by the Hainy family. Enjoy!

Fast Beef Taco Skillet

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 can tomato soup
- ½ cup salsa
- 1/2 cup water 6 flour 6" tortillas, cut into strips
- 1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese



Brown ground beef. Stir in soup, salsa, water, and tortilla strips. Heat to boiling. Reduce heat to low & cook for 5 minutes. Stir. Top with cheese.

Makes 4 servings. Optional: Can top with sour cream, black olives, avocado, etc.

Slow Cooker Chicken Enchilada Casserole (from the magicalslowcookier.com)

- 1.5 lbs. boneless skinless raw chicken breasts (don't use any more than 1.5 pounds, the casserole will seem dry if you do).
- 28 oz. can Red Enchilada Sauce
- Add these items at the end:
- 10 corn tortillas I use a 10-12 oz. package of soft corn tortillas.
- 2 cups grated cheddar cheese divided
- 3.8 oz. can black olives divided

Put the chicken breasts and the enchilada sauce in your 6 quart or larger slow cooker. Cook on **HIGH for 4 hours** or **LOW for 6-8 hours.**

Shred the chicken with 2 forks right in the slow cooker. Cut the tortillas in to strips, add to chicken and sauce. Stir. Add 1/2 cup of cheese and half the olives into the sauce and chicken mixture. Stir again. Flatten the mixture. Add the rest of the cheese and the olives on top.

Cook on low for about 40 - 60 minutes longer.

Top with sour cream (optional).
