## **AMBIENCE**

THE ALEDO UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

Ambience- noun- "the atmosphere of a place". Ambience is an important aspect of a place. Think about it- you walk into McDonalds...you expect a certain kind of ambience. You walk into a 5-Star restaurant...you expect a very different kind of ambience. Wal-Mart has a much different ambience than Sacks Fifth Avenue. It doesn't necessarily make one better than the other...just different. There is a certain feel when you walk into a building. Sometimes the feel is intentionally designed to put you in a certain frame of mind, while other times the ambience you experience has NO intentionality about it... it just...IS.

I have been thinking about ambience a lot lately. Having done a decent amount of restaurant work, as well as managing retail businesses and professional theaters, I have a strong appreciation for the power of well-planned and executed ambience. I am immediately in the RIGHT frame of mind when the intended ambience works. Likewise, I am immediately in the WRONG frame of mind when it doesn't. In fact, I have literally turned around and walked back out of a restaurant based on A. how dirty the building was and B. how we were greeted!

I don't know about you but the one thing I hear, over and over, with GREAT consistency, from people who talk about The Aledo United Methodist Church is how friendly and welcoming we are. My response? "I would LOVE to take credit for that, but they all greeted my family exactly the same way when WE first walked in the door!" This is a VERY friendly and welcoming congregation...sometimes DESPITE your pastor!

In recent months, we have made some "improvements" to heighten that sense of welcoming. The two biggest pieces that have been added are The Hospitality Team and The Fellowship Café. How awe-some is it that, before someone ever reaches the sanctuary on Sunday morning or the dining room on Wednesday night, they have already been greeted and welcomed?! How awesome is it that, by the time most people actually sit in a pew on Sunday morning, they have had probably 3, 4...10 people speak to them?!

Likewise, to stand in the Fellowship Café area at 9AM on a Sunday morning is a GREAT thing! Tons of conversation going on. People laughing. People talking. People sharing. AND...people eating good breakfast food and drinking good coffee! It has been a GREAT addition!

So, are we a friendly, welcoming congregation because we have a Fellowship Café and a Hospitality Team? I would answer that with a resounding..."NO!" It's the exact polar opposite of that, in fact! You are a friendly, welcoming congregation regardless of coffee bars and people at the door. In fact, the reason we HAVE those things is because you were already a friendly, welcoming congregation and wanted to ramp that up even more!

We are growing. In a climate of churches losing ground and churches closing their doors for good because they don't have the support to keep going...we are growing. And the reason we are growing is simple- it's YOU! People in search of a church home are simply not looking for tons of bells and whistles. Oh sure, those bells and whistles can be nice and all, but if they are housed in a congregation that puts off a vibe that says, "Yeah, yeah...glad you're here...just don't sit in MY pew!", then those church seekers won't stay. But if instead they find a friendly, welcoming bunch of folks who seem genuinely glad they are there...they are likely to stay...even if the church doesn't have every bell and whistle they seek.

So…keep doing what you're doing. Welcome people, honestly and sincerely, for no other reason but that…they're here! Be glad to see them. Remember how you felt when you were the "newbie". Remember that, regardless of what society says, when we come together as the body of Christ, we are RADICALLY equal in His eyes. Thank you for being SO friendly and SO welcoming…and keep up the good work!

Last month we told you about wanting to purchase an AED- Automated External Defibrillator. An automated external defibrillator is a portable device that checks the heart rhythm. If needed, it can send an electric shock to the heart to try to restore a normal rhythm. AEDs are used to treat sudden cardiac arrest. And thanks to your incredibly generous donations, we raised the necessary funds in just TWO weeks! The unit, and the accompanying "kits", will be purchased and installed soon. There will be a training session that will cover both the use of the AED Unit and CPR. If you are interested, watch/listen for that announcement coming up! Again...thank you!!

## **YOUNG ADULT MINISTRIES**

If you have any children, you remember...you will ALWAYS remember...the day they were born. There are a very small handful of days that stand out in my life, and be assured that the day my gorgeous wife was silly enough to say "I do" is at the top, and the birth of both of my boys is right up there as well!

The birth of a new ministry is pretty exciting, too! And I got the extreme pleasure of experiencing that recently! One of the most under-represented groups in this church...in MOST churches...is the "young family/couple" group. Some churches lack in that area because they simply don't HAVE enough folks who fit into that category while others lack in that area because they aren't sure what to DO with that group.

Over the 20 months that I have been at this church, our "pool" of young families/couples has grown, which is an AWESOME. So in recent months, a few of us have been in discussion about what we could do to intentionally reach out to those folks with a ministry geared specifically for them. Out of that discussion grew the recent event.

We struggled with how we would "label" this group. We thought the "family" designation was important, but we didn't want to limit it to only those who had kids. We thought the "young" designation was important, but we didn't want that to make some feel that they didn't belong. (I mean, I'm going to be 53 in less than 2 months and we have a kid in Junior High!) We thought the "couple" designation was important, but we didn't want to leave out anybody who was either a single parent or fit into the age group. So we were as SPECIFIC as possible while being as GENERAL as possible! (Clear as MUD, Pastor!)

We put together a dinner that we called Late Valentine's Day Dinner, arranged babysitting and sent out personal invitations. We planned the dinner (pork loin, baked potato, broccoli, salad and cheesecake!) and the décor. (I am, by the way, eternally grateful for Ruth Dulaney and Deb Swank who have an incredible eye for style and detail- that saved us from the paper plates and chili dogs I would have planned!) And then...Friday night came!

8 families were represented at the dinner, with 5 other families who WANTED to come but had other commitments. I don't know about you, but 8 families for the maiden voyage of a new ministry is pretty doggone awesome! They were intentionally seated in groups of 4 and then the serving, by Ruth, Deb and Molly and Bill Joseph, began. During the salad course, they were invited to A. as couples fill out a Valentine's Day trivia quiz and B. each write down something that most people wouldn't know about them. Then we ate the main course...which was AMAZING! (Thank you, Stan Swank, for your awesome culinary skills!) After that we gave door prizes for the couples who got the most trivia questions correct.

As we ate dessert, I read the "thing most people wouldn't know about you", one at a time, and those gathered had to try and figure out who wrote it. It was A. quite fun and B. pretty enlightening! (Mine was that, in a ""former life" as the Business Manager of a professional theater/entertainment venue, I once wrote Jay Leno a check for \$40,000!)

We spent the rest of the 90-minute evening talking about what THEY wanted this new ministry to be. It seems to me that an awful lot of churches seem to think that THEY know what a group like this would want to do and therefore they simply dictate what that will be. I wanted to know what THEY wanted! We then made plans for moving forward, finished dessert and went home. It was a GREAT evening and...I pray...the beginning of a marvelous ministry opportunity!





## ST. PATRICK'S DAY

St. Patrick is the patron saint and national apostle of Ireland. He is credited with bringing Christianity to Ireland. Most of what is known about him comes from his two works; The Confessio, a spiritual autobiography, and his Epistola, a denunciation of British mistreatment of Irish Christians. Although it's not known for sure why we celebrate St. Patrick's Day on March 17<sup>th</sup>, one theory is that it's the day St. Patrick died. It is a religious holiday in Ireland, with many businesses closed. Have you ever wondered why the shamrock is so closely tied to St. Patrick's Day? Well, none other than St. Patrick himself used it to explain the Holy Trinity (Father, Son, Holy Spirit) to the pagans. 

#### **SIMPLE IS GOOD!**

I Cor. 2:1-5 (NIV): And so it was with me, brothers and sisters. When I came to you, I did not come with eloquence or human wisdom as I proclaimed to you the testimony about God. For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. I came to you in weakness with great fear and trembling. My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Holy Spirit's power, so that your faith might not rest on human wisdom,

but on God's power.



Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth, upon this continent, a new nation.

President Abraham Lincoln wrote and delivered his Gettysburg Address in November 1863. Lincoln reportedly wrote this speech on the train between Washington and Gettysburg.

As presidential speeches go, it's one of the shortest, coming in at less than three hundred words. Maybe that's why it has stood the test of time.

Paul shares a valuable lesson that Lincoln must have known: THERE IS POWER IN SIMPLICITY. When your message is true--as Paul's was--you don't need to hide behind superlatives and hype. In fact, the hoopla often detracts from the focus of what you're trying to accomplish.

I'm not arguing for poorly written or inane communication (neither Paul nor Lincoln insulted their readers' intelligence), but take a look at YOUR message. DO YOU NEED A SUPERLATIVE FILTER?

DEAR HEAVENLY FATHER, OFTEN TIMES WE TRY TO SHARE YOUR MESSAGES IN OUR POWER THROUGH FEEBLE HUMAN WORDS...WE GET CAUGHT UP IN MAKING THINGS OVERLY COMPLICATED, ONCE AGAIN RELYING ON OUR OWN STRENGTH. AUTHOR & FINISHER OF OUR FAITH, I PRAY YOUR DISCERNMENT AND ALL CONSUMING PASSION ON OUR LIVES. MAY WE SEEK YOUR HOLY SPIRIT'S POWER IN DELIVERING THE GOSPEL OF YOUR REDEEMING GRACE. AMEN!!!
