

Grace & Peace from the Pastor's Desk

The cold has come upon us. We have darkness in the early evening. Soon we will have swirling snow replacing our swirling leaves. I can wait! Christmas Eve would be the perfect time for that snow, after services are over of course. I am looking forward to Christmas Eve, as always.

I've been listening to Trans-Siberian Orchestra's rendition of "Anno Domine", and it fills me with hope, the promise that the child who is born on this night will bring redemption to all persons.

It brings the promise that no one is "misbegotten", that is not acceptable or unplanned. It brings me hope that in Christ we are all one. So, as I'm thinking about Christmas, I am thinking of all the persons who belong in the Christmas story.

When I think of Mary, a young girl who accepts what God has in store for her, most likely not realizing what she was getting herself into, I think of blind faith. She allowed herself to carry a child out of wedlock, something in her day that could have caused her to be stoned to death, trusting that God would make it right.

When I think of Joseph, I think of a man who felt betrayed, then after having a dream where the angel told him the truth, he accepted that Mary was carrying the Son of God. When I think of Joseph, I think of accepting God's word as the truth.

When I think of the innkeeper, I think of a man who was compassionate. He truly had no room in the inn but found a safe place for the birth of a child, not knowing that he would be having angels and shepherds grace his stable.

When I think of the shepherds, the lowliest persons in their society, receiving the angelic message, I think that God comes for all people, no matter their station in life.

When I think of King Herod I think of evil, and how good defeats evil.

When I think of the magi, I think of people from foreign places who seek to find the King of kings.

And when I think of Jesus I think of love, hope, peace, and joy. A baby born in a stable, what a humble beginning! Then I recall the words of Isaiah 9:6-7 "For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onward and forevermore."

And when I think of you and me, because yes, we belong in the Christmas story as well, I think of all the generations who have heard this story, who have been filled with wonder, and have passed it from generation to generation. It is a story that needs to be told to all people in all places. I pray you are telling the story.

I WONDER AS I WANDER




Pastor Kostur is leading our adult Sunday School/Advent study this year and it is taking place in the lounge after worship unless otherwise indicated.


