Dakota Sacred Sites Tour - Dr. Darlene St. Clair

Date: Wednesday, October 4, 2023, 8:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.

Location: Bus Tour (Depart from NWSISD Office), and TBD lunch on your own

Description: We are living, learning, and working in a particular place with a long, fascinating, troubling, and frequently unknown story. One goal for this tour is that participants begin to experience the place we live in as Mnisota Makoce, the Dakota homelands. We will be visiting several Dakota sacred sites located in an area that would later be called the Twin Cities. How has colonization impacted Dakota use and access to these places? How have Dakota people asserted a continuing relationship with these places? What happens when this history is unknown by Minnesotans. How can educators work to address this gap in knowledge and understanding? This tour will provide participants with a more nuanced and detailed understanding of the place we call home.

The Impacts of Mental Health and Behavior - TBD

Date: Wednesday, November 1, 2023, 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. **Location**: NWSISD Office

Description: Participants will examine how our mental health affects behavior. Participants will also learn how the events that shaped last few years have impacted and traumatized our youth while playing a role in how students behave at school.

N-Word Part 1 - Ayenna Davis, NWSISD

Description: Learn about the usage of the N-Word in history, media, and current pop culture. Learn about the various perceptions middle school and high school students have regarding the N-Word. Identify areas in instruction, curriculum, and/or work with students where teaching about the N-Word would support student learning, achievement and/or behavior. Learn and develop strategies for addressing the N-Word with students to support learning, achievement, and/or behavior. Participants will create a plan of how to implement the learning from workshop to everyday teaching.
