



Message from the Venerable Master



Words from a Travelling Man ...

Greetings to one and all!

From the early morning hours of Saturday January 25th to the late evening of Monday January 27th 2020, I had the amazing fortune to be the only Texas Mason to travel to ALL of the Scottish Rite Valleys of our neighboring state of New Mexico. This was a feat I could never have accomplished in the same amount of time for ALL the Valleys in our Great State of Texas. The reason is quite simple really; there being only *two* Valleys in the state of New Mexico. Santa Fe being 310 miles (4 hours 45 minutes) distant and Las Cruces a mere 46 miles (40 minutes) from us. Lubbock, the closest Valley in our home state is a bit farther at 346 miles (5 hours 30 minutes road time).

The Burn's Night Dinner hosted by the Santa Fe Scottish Rite Temple Historical Preservation Foundation on Saturday evening was actually my first of the kind attended. It was well thought out and produced to flow and keep the evening moving. After an hour of cocktails and tours, the guests were seated and introductions, the Addressing of the Haggis and toasts commenced which preceded dinner. Entertainment was provided by Gaelic dancers, a Gaelic folk singer, the Santa Fe Women's Ensemble, Toasts to the Laddies & Lassies and stimulating conversation by those seated at our table. Also as a part of the evening was a silent auction with various and sundry items and services for bid.

The Santa Fe Valley Knights of St. Andrew were instrumental in the preparation and serving of the buffet dinner and the Master of Ceremonies himself was a member of that Order. The evening ended with the traditional singing while all stood in a circle of Auld Lang Syne.

Two days later I was happily welcomed to the Las Cruces Scottish Rite Monthly Stated Communication where I had business to bring before the Knights of St. Andrew after the meeting and I sat with the Grand Master of Masons in New Mexico. An interesting note here is that with the exception of the Commander of the Council of Kadosh and the Prior, *all* officers were the Glengarry of a Knight of St. Andrew.

This was my first time to "visit" not just one but two different valleys of the Scottish Rite and I must say, both Valleys welcomed me warmly and were the most gracious of hosts. I highly recommend travelling and visiting other valleys and should those Valleys be the two closest to our home, I believe I can say with all honesty that you will be welcomed as warmly as warmly as was I.
