January 13, 2019 The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord Lk 3:15-16, 21-22

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Happy Baptism of the Lord! I love how our church celebrates the Baptism of Jesus at what we think is the end of the Christmas season. The Greek word 'baptizo' means to 'immerse, plunge into, initiate or enter something'. So, having such a 'starter' feast at the end of Christmas, tells me that Christmas is not over. We are just getting going! We are just beginning. Beginning what? Beginning Life With Christ! We may box up our decorations, and put away the trappings of Christmas, but we keep on full display our practice of Christian faith. Jesus was born to join us in our lives and us in His life! All that we celebrate and share during Christmas time is to remain visible and be reflected in our lives. We do not shut away or closet our faith after Christmas. The generosity, gratitude and altruism that abounds during Christmas should turn into a daily responsibility, to enact the humble prayer of Tiny Tim that "God may bless us, every one!" Every person, every day! Controversy creeps up sometimes about whether Christmas should be celebrated in a lower key to not offend non-Christians. When I was in college one winter, I asked a Muslim friend what he thought of Christmas. I asked if he felt left out or put upon with all of our public Christmas songs and programs. He said he loved Christmas! He remarked that at Christmas, he found people nicer and friendlier in public. He thought we should have Christmas all the time! I agree! Today's Baptism of Jesus feast reminds us that we are baptized into Christ, and so our 'living like Christ' is not just a season, but it is a way of life. Baptism into Jesus means we are immersed into Christ's life completely. Not just around the edges and not just on the outside, but we are to live in and breathe through Christ just as a fish does in water!

Here are some of the bible images of what it means to be baptized: "You who were baptized into Christ have <u>clothed yourselves</u> with Christ" (Gal 3:27), "then, <u>put on the new self</u>, created in God's way" (Eph 4:24), and "You were <u>buried with him</u> in baptism" (Col 2:12). The word 'baptism' itself and God's own Word of scripture indicates that baptism is all encompassing and complete, not just simply dipping a toe in to living Christ, but plunging ourselves entirely into Christianity! To break it down, baptism means we get completely into it, not just a little, not just *barely*, but we go all in!

Thinking about not just 'dabbling' with baptism, but diving right in, makes me think of my first experience volunteering for a seat in a dunking tank for a parish fundraiser. I received an education! Experienced dunking booth athletes taught me later tips such as scheduling yourself the first to go in, to bob around in the freshest water (before everybody has been washed off in it and all the dirt/rust from the bottom is stirred up). Someone else pulled me aside to say I should use my feet to catch myself and remain standing in the water keeping my head from going under, or to at least hold my nose. I felt that to keep from going underwater water was cheating, because it was not called a 'splashing booth' but a 'dunking booth'. People were paying to see an immersion, not just a dipping. So learning it the hard way, I had too many dunkings to count. Though, I did begin to hold my nose at least (I don't want to gross anyone out, but I realized that the quick drop down into the water flushed out all the people in the booth before me's sinuses!) But, it was all for a good cause! The whole experience made me appreciate so much more the word 'baptizo'. Baptism into Christ is a complete immersion into His life, death and resurrection, being enveloped, surrounded and suffused with Christ! I always speak about the 'sign of the cross' being our mark and sign of baptism. I find all the meaning of baptism to be summarized in our prayer gesture of the cross, with its four points (top-bottom-left-right). It says to me that Christ is above, below, and all around me. Like the St Patrick hymn 'Christ be beside Me', we want Christ to be ahead, behind, on our right and on our left. And though sometimes people misunderstand or make fun of such a 'Christian gesture', we can say with St Paul "I am not ashamed of the gospel" (Romans 1:16), "For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (1 Corinthians 1:18). The cross means new life from death, and sin completely washed away (entirely reborn). The very first act at the baptism ceremony is the minister, parents and godparents tracing the cross on the child's forehead, giving them for the first time **the sign** of their membership in Christ's Body, the Church (1 Cor 12:13). May we live up to, out of and always in and through the baptismal grace we received in the beginning!
