Bishop Dr. Linda Jones-Hicks (Dixon), President

Bishop, Dr. Jones- Hicks (Dixon) is the Pastor/CEO Founder of the "Sword of the Word Ministries, Incorporated, located in Lawnside, New Jersey. She serves there with her husband Pastor Charles Dixon.



As Pastor/educator of the Sword of the Word Ministry she provides seminars and workshops with Evangelist Revival teachings in the church. She's an anointed woman of God, a powerful intercessor, and a skillful teacher. She served as President of Free Women in Christ (FWIC) of the Southern New Jersey Chapter for a period of 19 years and was promoted within the National Organization of FWIC to area Vice-President of the national staff; which included New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland and Delaware. Dr. Jones- Hicks (Dixon) launched a FWIC remnant in 2003 emerging as a new leader, President/CEO of Purposed Women with Power, Inc. (PWPP). Purposed Women with Power has become an international ministry with greater than 20 chapters throughout the United States, including Trinidad and South Africa. The mission is focused on addressing the spiritual needs of women hungry for the truth of the gospel.

As a Pediatrician/Adolescent Medicine Specialist she has served as Director of Adolescent Medicine and clinical professor at Pediatrics at University of Medical and Dentistry/SOM Medical School for a period of 9 years. In this dual role she also was Division head of Adolescent Medicine at Cooper Children's Regional Hospital (nine years). In 2003 until present she is named "Top Doc" of Pediatric/Adolescent Medicine in Southern New Jersey by her peers..

With many years of service in the clinical arena she served in the capacity of Director of Maternal, Child and Community Health for the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services.

This Directorship at the Department of health and Senior Services was from 2003-2007. Whereby serving on multiple gubernatorial boards, advisory councils, and community outreach initiatives. Presently, Dr. Jones Hicks(Dixon) maintains a private practice "Genesis Pediatric Associates", W. Deptford, NJ.

Dr. Jones-Hicks (Dixon) is a much sought after Evangelist/Revivalist. She has ministered in churches, seminars and workshops throughout the world, such as Israel, Canada, Trinidad, Guatemala , Honduras, Haiti and Africa

As an Evangelist, her ministry is strong in deliverance, healing and intercession. Being a mother of a beautiful daughter, Mikal, she has a strong calling to minister youth. 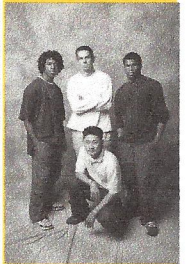
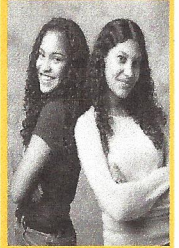

My name is Eric Bennett and together with my wife Stephanie we proudly own Mz Eazy's Cafe'. My wife and I are originally from the Philadelphia area but currently reside and run our business in Sicklerville, New Jersey. Before starting Mz Eazy's Cafe' I had a long and successful career within the electric utility construction industry. I've always had an entrepreneurial spirit and in the midst of a successful career I chose to shift gears. I recognized my passion for southern style cuisine and quickly became excited about an opportunity to create a family business and leave behind a legacy for our children and grandchildren. After months of hard work and dedication we were able to open our very own restaurant on July 8, 2014. Like most small businesses, Mz Eazy's faced challenges with acquiring capital through the traditional means. Banks within the commercial lending industry require a business to have a measurable track record and extensive knowledge within the field before they will approve a loan. This is one of the obstacles we struggled to overcome in our pursuit of success.

We worked diligently to raise the funds through non traditional means as well as utilizing our savings to obtain the capital needed to open our doors. We feel Mz Eazy's surpassed the original goals we put in place for the first year of business. With our first successful year under our belt we enter into our second year with more ambitious goals. We now have a greater understanding of the need for financial guidance, how to be creative in overcoming the seasonality of the the food industry and the need to continuously grow in knowledge of this industry; meeting with top chefs in the area periodically to cultivate a superior collection of meals that are competitive to the eateries in the surrounding area. Currently we are considering expanding the Cafe' into a vacant space adjacent to us which would allow us to cater to a larger customer base and provide live entertainment from local talent.
