AN ORDINANCE

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OR DISPOSAL OF PERSONAL
PROPERTY ACQUIRED THROUGH THE DLA/ LESO PROGRAMS**

WHEREAS, in the opinion of not less than simple majority of the corporate authorities of the City of Fostoria, it is no longer necessary or useful to or for the best interest of the City of Fostoria to retain ownership of the personal property hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fostoria acquired property through the federal programs known as DLA and LESO 1033, which are generally described as programs which distribute used and surplus military hardware to local law enforcement agencies, which programs are jointly administered by the Department of Defense and the Ohio Department of Public Safety, and

WHEREAS, disposal of surplus property is governed by LESO rules and regulations both federal and State of Ohio, and their respective program managers, and the City intends to comply in all respects with these rules and regulations, and

WHEREAS, the property described hereto has been approved for disposal, by both Federal and State program managers, and the orders of disposal allow certain equipment including some military hardware to be sold or transferred to both private and public entities, and

WHEREAS, no City tax dollars have been used to purchase or dispose of any LESO equipment.

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Council of the City of Fostoria that the property should be sold or disposed of on such terms as the Mayor and the Chief of Police should agree upon;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOSTORIA, SENECA, HANCOCK, AND WOOD COUNTIES, OHIO:

SECTION ONE. The Mayor and Chief of Police are hereby authorized and directed to sell or dispose of the property for the best cash price possible, considering the age and condition of the said property, and for the Clerk to execute such sales documents, titles and the like as necessary to complete the transaction or transactions.


SECTION TWO. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that

all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION THREE. That in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Fostoria and its inhabitants, this measure shall take effect at the earliest time allowed by law after its passage for the reason that this ordinance is necessary for the inhabitants of the City of Fostoria.


THEREFORE, upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected to Council, and signature by the Mayor, this ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.

A RESOLUTION

To approve a contract between the City of Fostoria, Ohio and the Board of the Fostoria City Schools relating to funding for two (2) "school resource officers," and declaring an emergency to exist.

WHEREAS, the City of Fostoria, Ohio previously entered into a contract with the Board of Education of the Fostoria City Schools (hereafter, "the schools"), in which the schools agreed to reimburse the City of Fostoria, Ohio for providing two police officers to serve as "school resource officers"; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service and Safety signed, on behalf of the City, a new Agreement with the schools effective August 1, 2019 through August 1, 2021; and,

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Fostoria hereby desires to contract with the schools for two additional calendar years for the provision of two (2) "school resources officers" in exchange for adequate compensation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Fostoria, Seneca, Hancock, and Wood Counties, Ohio:


SECTION 1. The Council of the City of Fostoria, Ohio hereby authorizes, directs and empowers the Director of Public Service and Safety to enter into a contract with the schools for the provision of two (2) "school resources officers" on terms that provide the City with adequate remuneration to be effective as of August 1, 2019 until August 1, 2021. This is a two year agreement.

SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code:

SECTION 3. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare and safety. The reason for such an emergency is the fact that the prior agreement between the Board of the Fostoria City Schools and the City expired on August 1, 2019.

THEREFORE, upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected to Council, and signature by the Mayor, this resolution shall go into immediate effect.



AN ORDINANCE

Adopting and Amending ordinance No. 2018-64 (Permanent 2019 Appropriations) by appropriating from unappropriated funds in the General Fund, Street Maintenance and Repair Fund, City Cleanup Fund, Water Fund, and Sewer Fund and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Fostoria, Seneca, Hancock, and Wood Counties, Ohio:

SECTION 1: That ordinance No. 2018-64 (Permanent 2019 Appropriations) passed December 18, 2018, be, and the same is hereby amended as delineated in the following sections:

SECTION 2: That One Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$1,300) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-150-531530 General Fund/Security of Persons and Property-Traffic/Contractual Services-Telephone.

SECTION 3: That One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-200-531500 General Fund/Public Health-Cemetery/Contractual Services-Electric.

SECTION 4: That One Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$1,200) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-200-531530 General Fund/Public Health-Cemetery/Contractual Services-Telephone.

SECTION 5: That One Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$1,400) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-200-541270 General Fund/Public Health-Cemetery/Materials and Supplies-Fuel.

SECTION 6: That One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-400-541100 General Fund/Community Environment-Zoning/Materials and Supplies-Office Supplies.

SECTION 7: That Four Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$4,300) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-499-531720 General Fund/Community Environment-Community Development/Contractual Services-CIC Contribution.

SECTION 8: That One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-741-561860 General Fund/General Government-Income Tax/Other-Refunds.

SECTION 9: That One Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars (\$1,900) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 201-620-531510 Street Maintenance and Repair Fund/Transportation-Street/Contractual Services-Gas.

SECTION 10: That Twenty Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$20,500) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 248-499-561860 City Cleanup Fund/Community Environment-Community Development/Other-Refunds.

SECTION 11: That Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 501-510-531510 Water Fund/Basic Utility-Water Treatment Plant/Contractual Services-Gas.

SECTION 12: That One Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$1,100) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 501-515-531510 Water Fund/Basic Utility-Water Distribution/Contractual Services-Gas.

SECTION 13: That Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 520-520-531510 Sewer Fund/Basic Utility-Waste Water Treatment Plant/Contractual Services-Gas.

SECTION 14: That this ordinance shall be published in accordance with applicable Ohio Law.

SECTION 15: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 16: That in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Fostoria and its inhabitants, and in order to make the appropriation adjustments in the Permanent 2019 appropriations without delay to meet pending obligations, this measure is determined to be an emergency ordinance and shall take effect at the earliest time allowed by law after its passage.


THEREFORE, upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected to Council, and signature by Mayor, this ordinance shall take immediate force and effect.


