This overview will give you a guideline and walk you through the steps in preparing for the weekend and set ups during the weekend.

Team Building Dates

- Set up Communion
- Pray for Pilgrims

Thursday of the Weekend:

- Help unload the trailer, place bins in proper location.
- Prayer Walk- all team.
- Wear a Cha apron.
- Set up Chapel for Sponsorship Communion
- Set Up Stations of the Cross
- Set up Meet and Greet / pilgrims
- Greet pilgrims upon arrival and help unload luggage (if needed)
- Attend Stations of the Cross
- Set the Prayer Chapel up after Sponsorship Communion and take bibles to Rollo Room.
- Reset Pilgrim Chapel for morning Chapel (communion)

Friday of the Weekend:

- Set Up Pilgrim Chapel (communion)
- Clean Up after Chapel
- Assist Kitchen Chas when needed with skits
- Fetch Rollist/Rollistas
- Pray over Rollist/Rollista in Prayer Chapel before they speak throughout the day
- Check prayer boxes – post all requests on white board
- Help Palanca deliver bags to the Rollo Room / cabins
- Set Up Decuria Prayer Time in Rolo Room
- Set up Footwashing
- Clean Up after footwashing
- Set up Pilgrim Chapel for Morning Chapel.
- Attend Poster Party (Rollo Room)
- Sign bibles in Rollo Room
- Team Meeting



Saturday of the Weekend:

- Set Up Pilgrim Chapel (no communion)
- Clean Up after Chapel
- Assist Kitchen Chas when needed with skits
- Set Up for Dying Moments
- Fetch Rollist/Rollistas
- Pray over Rollist/Rollista in Prayer Chapel before they speak throughout the day
 - Attend Dying Moments
- Check prayer boxes – post all requests on white board
- Set up Pilgrim Chapel for Morning Chapel.
- Assist with Serving Agape Dinner
- Set Up Decuria Time in Cabins
- Attend Poster Party (Rollo Room)
- Sign bibles in Rollo Room
- Team Meeting

Sunday of the Weekend:

- Set Up Pilgrim Chapel (no communion)
- Celebrate Mananitas
- Clean Up after Chapel
- Prepare the Prayer Chapel for the Chapel Visits by Pilgrims
- Pray over Rollist/Rollista in Prayer Chapel / or other location before they speak throughout the day
- Check prayer boxes
- Load as much as you can in the trailer
- Set Up for Clausura (Communion)
- Attend Rector/Rectora's talk
- Men attend Closed Clausura
- Help welcome in the pilgrims at the Clausura!!!
- Assist with final loading of trailer and do a final sweep of all cabins and help pick up the room where we did the Clausura!

CHA CHECKLIST – WHAT TO BRING

- A Servant's Heart
- Bible
- Pilgrim Guide
- Name tag (plain bologna and decorated)
- Cross necklace (for Open Clausura)
- Personal items (toothbrush, paste, soap, chap stick)
- Medications / vitamins
- Towel & washcloth
- Bedding (pillow, sheets, blankets, sleeping bag)
- Alarm clock
- Agape clothes (white shirt, dark pants/skirt, comfortable shoes)
- DeColores clothing
- Apron
- Flashlight (for walking to chapel on Thursday night)
- Jacket / sweater/ raincoat
- Palanca for pilgrims and lastly team (notes, food, etc.)

Please ensure that palanca is complete before the weekend.
