Tidings from Timothy

My favorite Old

Testament prophet, and probably my favorite OT book, is Jeremiah. You might think that strange since Jeremiah was known as the "weeping prophet" and the book is kind of a downer. However, the value of Scripture is not seen in just the "positive" parts. Most of the parts in the Bible we remember are counter-examples of a rather negative nature. In Jeremiah 8 we have him explaining to the Israelites the reason WHY they were not right with God. That is why I love the book, it gives you insight into not only this great man, but also into how God himself thinks. Let's study today on Jeremiah 8.

The Hatton Half: The Chain of Religious Authority (3)

The third link in our chain of authority is the third person of the Godhead, the Holy Spirit of God. Elements were promised that the Holy Spirit would accomplish, such as the guidance of the apostles into all truth. "Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come" (John 16:13). It was regarding this verse that Wacaster boldly proclaims:

When men clamor for continued revelation to every Tom, Dick and Harry that comes along claiming God spoke to him, I know such a person has not given serious thought to what our Lord said in this verse. "All" means 100%, and all the reasoning to the contrary cannot change that truth. The Lord's words do not leave room for 1%, or even 1/10th of 1%. Either the Holy Spirit guided these men into all truth, or He did not. It is a clear issue, and one that was settled long ago by the worlds of the Holy Spirit Himself: "Seeing that his divine power hath granted unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that called us by his own glory and virtue" (2 Pet. 1:3) (252-253).

If the Holy Spirit did not guide the apostles into all truth, then the God we serve is a liar (Tit. 1:2). However, we know this is not the case, for it opposes the nature of God Himself to lie (Heb. 6:18-19).
