Knowledge about how age, gender, intelligence, and mental health are normally evidenced in the tray can assist the therapist in understanding a client's trays and, thus, the issues of the client.

- Norms help therapists know what is typical and what is uncharacteristic for a particular age, for example, in order to determine if the child is more or less advanced than other children of the same age.
- If a person is below the norm, this may suggest a possible problem. For example, sandplay pictures of disturbed adults and children are often similar to those of young children.

- 1. Recognize stages of development in sandplay scenes
- 2. Describe the effects of age, gender, and intelligence on sandplay scenes
