This is the most important way for you to not only guide our meetings and to strengthen our church, but also for adding to the direction we take in the future. The box is on-going, but we need this first round of comments to help us complete the report.

Comments are appreciated about anything you wish to write about; no form, just your words. We want everyone to have an opportunity to be heard, and in doing so, make our church stronger. The committee set a goal in April to help guide us with our work. Please join us by helping to do


