half steps and flats



We may lower a note by a half step by using a b (flat) sign.

tip: When we go to the left on the keyboard the sound is lowered. Think of lowering the pitch or "flattening" it.

I use the anology of a tire: lowering the air pressure flattens it.

Recap:

A half step with the *same* letter name is called a <u>chromatic</u> half step (C to C_b). A half step with a <u>different</u> letter name is called a <u>diatonic</u> half step (C to C_b).


1. Study the keyboard.a) List all 7 chromatic half steps (ie. C Cb).b) List all 9 diatonic half steps (ie. C B).
