Come out to Lake Iowa Nature Center to be citizen scientists and participate in the Great Backyard Bird Count! We will start with a short presentation on what the count involves, make some pinecone bird feeders to hang and attract birds, then venture outside to count all of the beautiful birds! Launched in 1998 by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and National Audubon Society, the Great Backyard Bird Count was the first online citizen-science project to collect data on wild birds and to display results in near real-time. The peace of mind provided by the Essen Wagen volunteers for the seniors and their guardians cannot be overestimated. Home delivered meals also help homebound seniors remain more independent.
