DALLAS HOME PRICES RISE

According to the latest S&P/Case-Shiller Home Price Index, prices for pre-owned homes in the Dallas area increased at twice the national rate and were up 8.6% in February 2015 compared to the previous year.

S&P's David M. Blitzer noted in the report that while prices are certainly rebounding, only two U.S. cities, Dallas and Denver, have surpassed their pre-recession housing boom peaks, Dallas Prices in the Case-Shiller are now significantly higher than before the recession.

"A shortage of homes for sale has pushed up prices by more than 20% over the last year in some Dallas are neighborhoods", noted housing analyst Ted Wilson of Residential Strategies Inc. "With the persistently short supply of housing inventory for both new and pre-owned homes, it's hard to imagine that prices won't continue to rise".

David Brown, with housing analyst MetroStudy, Inc. also indicated that "The problem is exaggerated at the lower price points under \$250,000. Inventory is shrinking in the lower price ranges."

Around the Neighborhood

Jeff and Joan Friedman on Glen Canyon noticed a handsome, but scruffy looking gray cat that started hanging around the house begging for meals. The cat was friendly, but looked as if he had been left to fend for himself for too long. One day the Friedmans noticed that the cat was limping, and they posted a notice on Nextdoor wondering who this friendly guy belonged to. Turned out that no one claimed him, yet a number of families in the neighborhood had been feeding him -- even giving him a variety of nicknames including Smokey and Romeo. Well-known throughout the neighborhood, the cat had a habit of eating breakfast with the Friedmans before politely watching the birds eat out of a feeder at another neighbor's before stopping at another family's house to lay out by their pool in the afternoon. He was such a friendly, outgoing cat that he had a number of feeding stations scattered throughout the neighborhood that he visited regularly.

The Friedmans notice on Nextdoor brought an immediate response from Virginia Stuart, a neighbor on Hickory Crossing, who had been diligently feeding the friendly stray. Stuart sprung into action volunteering to head up the save the Smokey Blue cat campaign. She canvassed the neighborhood, located many of the cat's hangouts, and solicited the help of neighbors to catch him. Smokey was such a sweet cat, that no one could bear the thought of him being picked up by the humane society (which is usually a death sentence to many animals). "I already have a couple of dogs and cats that I've rescued in recent years, and didn't have room for any more pets, but Smokey stole my heart, so I was willing to make room for him if no one else wanted him. I had become attached to Smokey, and was absolutely determined that this beautiful cat would not be carted off and put down," said Stuart.

Once Smokey was captured, Stuart took him to the SPCA in McKinney to have the cat thoroughly checked out and neutered under the reasonably-priced feral cat program. Despite Smokey's months of living on the street, the kindness of his Country Forest neighbors saved the cat's life. Smokey was lucky. He was young and strong, and hadn't been on the street long enough to contract any deadly diseases that typically befalls homeless animals. And, while he now sports a jaunty clipped ear which is a testament to his years on the street, he is as handsome as ever, and is living with the Friedman's who have renamed him Jake making him one of the newest four-legged neighbors on Glen Canyon.

The moral of this story is, we live in a nice neighborhood with terrific neighbors willing to help one another and help some of our four-legged friends too. All too often animals "find" their way into Country Forest / Jackson Meadows, and helping those lost souls unites neighbors and helps find forever homes for homeless animals.

Did you know.....

Are street lights out on your street? Go to oncor.com. Click on street light issues and follow the instructions. They'll have it fixed in no time.

Is there graffiti on a nearby wall or fence? Go to DallasCityHall.com. Click on Graffiti Abatement program. Tell 'em where it is, and they'll paint over it.

Are you paying too much for electricity? Check your energy bill and find out what you pay per kilowatt hour. Currently, several energy companies offer plans with power for less than 5 cents/kwh. Go to Power-toChoose.org, fill in your zip code, and click on "show me the plans." In the CFJM area a typical house will use in excess of 2000 kwh/month.
