Maximum enrollment for any class is around 25 people, sometimes less. Classes may fill quickly; so please register early.

Cancellation/ Refunds: Refunds are issued only if a class is cancelled. Some classes may be cancelled if enrollment is low, so it is best if you register early for classes you like to help assure the class can be taught. Classes may be cancelled for inclement weather. Absences from classes will not be refunded, including brief illnesses, conflicts, or moving out of the area. Refund policy will be strictly enforced. Please choose your classes carefully. Contact staff if you have questions or needs.

Weather: In general, the school will follow the guidelines for the Elmbrook School District for inclement weather. You should hear the announcement on radio or see it on TV. If a class is held only one session, a cancellation will result in a refund. If an alternate date or multiple sessions are held, we will try to include missed content in the other or later sessions. Also, call or check your email.

Parking: Parking is FREE and available in the CUMC Parking Lot, which you can access via Watertown Plank Road and/or the Madera Circle. There is limited parking on the west side of the church off Highland Drive. **NO PARKING** is permitted on Highland Drive itself. The posted speed limit is 25 mph in town.
