General Meeting via ZOOM September 20, 2021 Birding in Northern Colombia, South America. Ad Konings

He photographed over 160 different species, most of them near Minca in the Santa Marta Mountains, and he will be sharing some of them with us.

Celebration of Our Mountains September 11, 2021 7:00am

Join Audubon star birder, Star Posada, on a field trip to <u>Percha Dam State Park</u> just an hour-and-one-half drive from El Paso. (MAP) Meet at Cabela's near Artcraft and the freeway (<u>MAP</u>) at 7:00 AM to carpool or caravan.

Percha Dam is a great place to watch birds, especially during migration. This State Park is an open bosque of cottonwoods. Some of the birds you can see are woodpeckers, warblers, Phainopepla, flycatchers and vireos.

Bring mosquito repellant, sunscreen, a hat, good walking tennis shoes/boots. You will be walking through thick vegetation so pants are recommended. Don't forget your binoculars and field guide books if you have them.

Bring a sack lunch for a picnic at the park. There is a \$5 Day Use Fee per Vehicle.



AT FEATHER LAKE

After 11 straight dry months, runoff from storms in late June fully flooded the Feather Lake basin, with a peak water depth of 3.18 feet on June 29. Water levels fluctuated over the next few weeks but trended downward until the basin was effectively dry on July 18. But later that day another storm hit, and on the morning of July 19 water in the basin was 4.7 feet deep...and still rising. The next day, the water was at least 6.65 feet deep, the deepest it has been since the storms of 2006. Why don't we know the exact depth? Our 6.65-foot tall water-level gauge was completely under water.

The runoff from the recent storms, of course, brought with it a new accumulation of trash. Our next workday will be **Sat., August 14,** starting at **8 a.m.** If conditions permit, we'll work on trash removal. Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave.



Update: Since last Monday, the water depth at Feather Lake has shot up again. Aug. 15th, the water-level gauge was again completely under water, which puts the depth at greater than 6.65 feet. Aug. 16th, based on the water level beneath the bridge over the inlet on North Loop, it was
