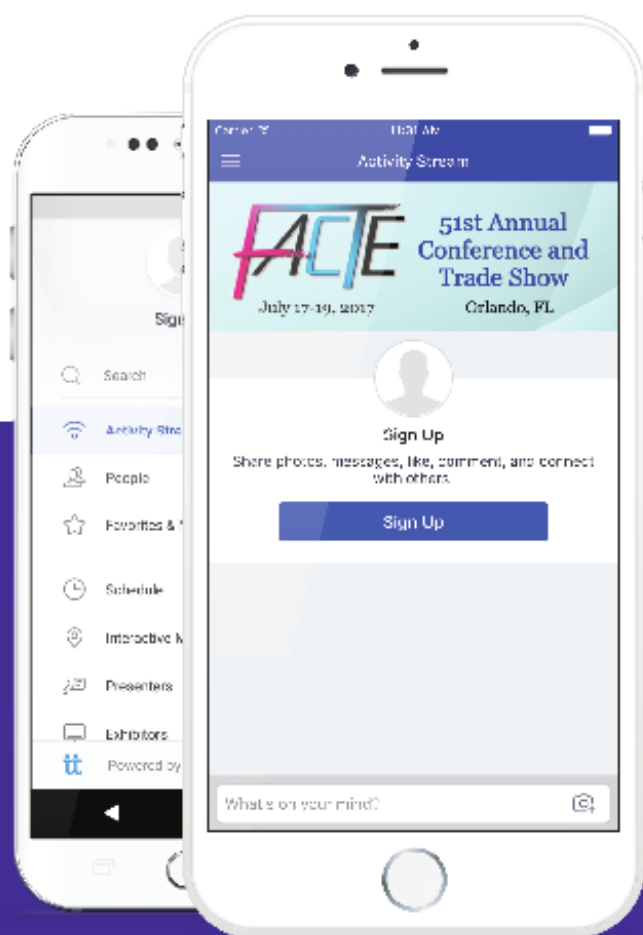

A Letter from FACTE's President



Annual Awards Program

Carl Proehl Award

To recognize those career and technical educators who currently have performed active service above his/her regular educational duties to career and technical education within the state of Florida. The recipient of this award must demonstrate a leadership role in promotional and leadership activities which increased local or statewide support for career and technical education. The recipient must also have been involved in activities promoting the goals of the Florida Association for Career and Technical Education. This award symbolizes the qualities and leadership exemplified by Dr. Carl Proehl for whom this award is named.

D.C. Jaeger Corporation – FACTE Student Award

A tuition scholarship for \$1000 is awarded to an outstanding career & technical education student for the first year of enrollment at any state university or community college with a major field of applied technology or other career and technical field.

Hall of Fame— Professional & Support

The Hall of Fame was established to perpetually recognize our most outstanding and distinguished professional career and technical educators and support professionals, organizations or businesses, who have made a long term significant impact on the field of career and technical education in Florida.

Joe Mills Career Excellence Award

To recognize a career and technical educator who has made outstanding contributions that are of state and/or national significance. This significance should be aimed toward the improvement, promotion, development and progress of career and technical education. This award was established in 1987 to honor Joe Mills for his consummate dedication to the goals of career and technical education and the profession throughout his career. This dedication was evident through his responsiveness to the training needs of the citizens of our great state and nation. This award is designed to honor individuals whose careers exemplify a similar dedication to the development of people through career and technical education, exemplified by Joe Mills.

Carl Perkins Humanitarian Award

This award will be presented to an individual whose career has been marked by actions that have enabled career and technical education programs to respond more fully to the individual needs of people for assistance in achieving more productive lives.

President's Award

To recognize a full-time adult or career and technical education teacher who is providing outstanding programs for youth and/or adults in their respective fields and communities. The recipient of this award shall have performed active service, above his/her regular educational duties, to adult or career and technical education within the state of Florida and shall have performed service to FACTE, their professional association.

Rookie Award

To recognize a beginning adult or career and technical education teacher who has made an outstanding contribution through his/her special enthusiasm, quality of work and student performance.

Walter Clausen Award

To recognize a person in business or industry for the highest meritorious contribution to the improvement, promotion, development and progress of career and technical education in the state of Florida. This award symbolizes the qualities and leadership of Walter Clausen, a business leader whose outstanding service on the State Advisory Council for Career and Technical Education promoted quality career and technical education in Florida.

CAD Academy Innovation Award

To recognize exemplary practices in interdisciplinary learning strategies, community involvement programs (business partnership, higher education), special events, grant delivery systems, and other innovations.

Outstanding Student Award—Secondary & Postsecondary

To honor special students for outstanding achievements in career and technical education in Florida

Each year the Florida Association for Career & Technical Education recognizes outstanding professional adult and career & technical educators through an awards program with outreach to all members in every area of Florida. In addition to the annual awards, FACTE also awards outstanding career & technical educators and students, and other contributors to CTE.

St. Johns County School District has a fine-tuned recruitment and application/request process for students desiring to be in Career Academies and other Programs of Choice, which include IB, AICE, JROTC, and the School for the Arts. Historically, the request process was done through Select Survey, but large numbers of request finally broke that system. In close collaboration with our School District IT Dept., we were able to make changes to the eSchool Plus Student Database system, so that students through their Student Portal could make requests. For school year 17-18, 2,201 students submitted 4,572 requests. 2,151 students were accepted into at least one Program of Choice. Only 23 eligible students who submitted requests were unable to be placed into anything. The actual placement process took 2 1/2 hours! This presentation will share the recruitment process we follow and tips on how other Student Database Programs may be able to be modified to set-up a similar request process.

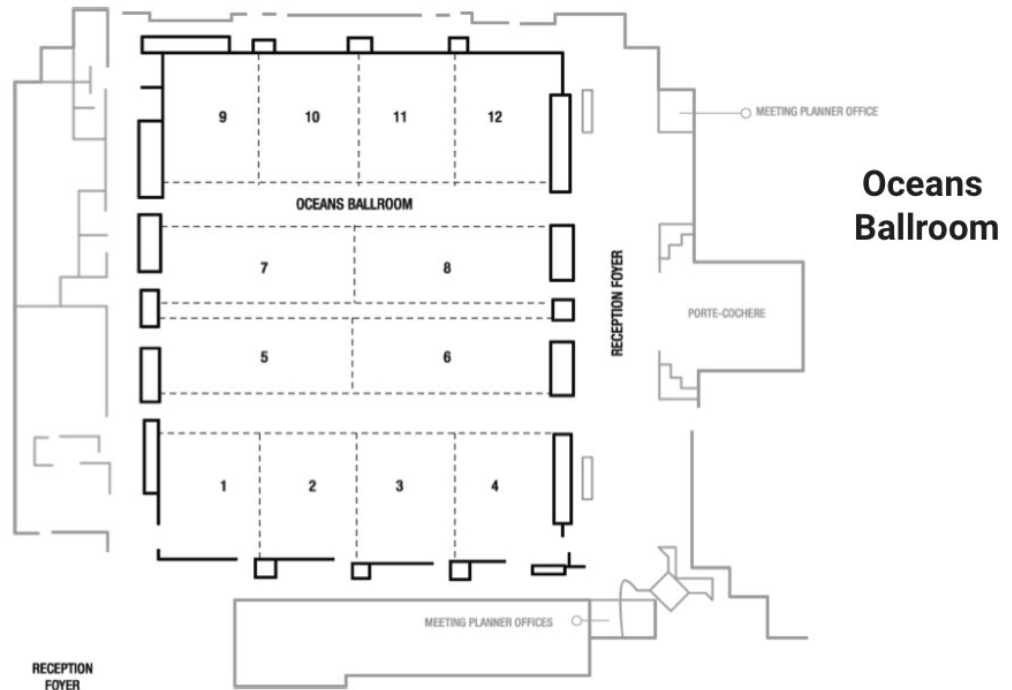
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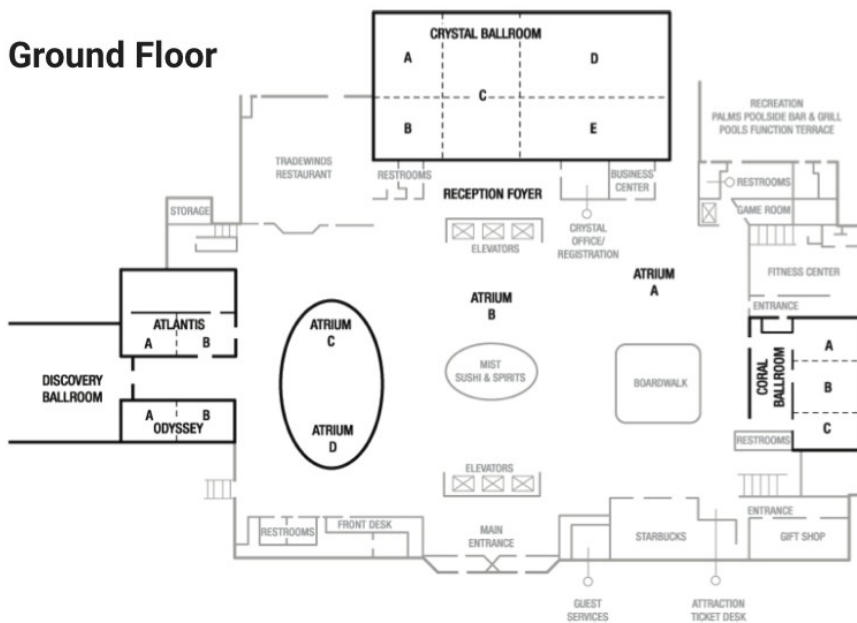
