

To work with stakeholders to advocate for responsible use and management of Mather Field resources.

As of the January 2017 Sacramento County Board of Supervisors Meeting, the Mather Alliance achieved the following accomplishments:

Wins

- . Eliminate proposed 152-acre university and 126-acre sports park.
- . Build 25-acre environmental educational campus with a building for Sac Splash.
- . Preserve additional 110 acres.
- . Preserve Spadefoot and Splash Critter vernal pools.
- Reduce traffic on Zinfandel Road: Keep as 2-lane road. Add 3 traffic-calming roundabouts and curves.
- . Prevent environmentally destructive mining.
- . Trench for sewer line with the least invasive construction method.
- . And other achievements.

Proposed/Pending

- . Reinstate Eagles Nest Road to its original name.
- . Build a vehicular bridge over Folsom South Canal to divert traffic to Sunrise.
- . Eagles Nest Road:
 - . 36 mph speed limit for safety to wildlife, pedestrians, bicyclists.
 - . Install rubberized asphaltic concrete to quiet traffic noise.
 - . Incorporate wildlife crossings.
- . Construct Douglas Road bypass to Excelsior Road traffic away from Mather.

Update as of May 10, 2018:

Sewer Trench Construction

The County is still working with the "feds" (Army Corps of Engineers) to get permits. The lack of permits delays the project construction start until at least next year.

Mather South Master Plan

Todd Smith, Principal Planner for the Sacramento County Department of Community Development, Planning and Environmental Review, told us that he and his staff meet twice monthly with Phil Rodriguez, Lewis Group Planned Communities, to discuss technical studies, permitting, and other details in an effort to finalize the Mather South Master Plan document. Todd forecasts that they will publish the master plan sometime this summer; however, he cannot provide a specific date.

Mather South Project Construction

Before Lewis Group can start construction, they not only need the sewer permitted and operational, but they also need federal permits for the Mather South project. Both projects are on hold until the federal agencies issue permits.

DEIR Responses and Proposed Final Environmental Impact Report

Todd and his staff are diligently working to finalize the responses and report and expects to publish the report sometime this summer. In the meantime, he plans to reconvene the Mather Stakeholder's Group so he and his staff can present a preview of the master plan document before they publish it. They expect to go through the Community Planning Action Committee and Planning Commission meetings, and then present it to the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors (BOS) by the end of 2018.

Sacramento County Planning and Environmental Review promises the Mather Stakeholder Group to preview the master plan document before they present it to the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors. Meeting date TBA.
