REACH of Cherokee and Graham County, Inc. is an outreach program for victims of domestic violence.

As the staff travel to the schools to discuss domestic violence, they have identified a need for children's shoes, underwear, and socks of varying sizes. They have also adopted some families to help as well. If you have items of clothing (clean and in good condition), children's books, etc. to donate please place them in the blue bin located in the pantry. Check out the clearance section at Walmart next time you go shopping.

Stacy can always use some small tote bags and small travel size items to fill them with, e.g. travel size shampoo and conditioner, toothbrushes, tooth paste, travel size deodorant, hand sanitizer, etc. Place items on the table located in the pantry on your left as you enter.

Please contact the REACH office staff if you have furniture you want to donate to arrange pickup by the Thrift Store volunteers. They also ask for cooking utensils to help victims start over. Often the victims leave home with only the clothes on their back, so they are given clothes, furniture, and items for the home from the Thrift Store until they can get back on their feet. They also can use items to help with their self-esteem and pass the time until they can be placed in a safe environment. You can provide puzzles (500 pieces or less), adult coloring books, reading material, word puzzles, make -up, nail polish, hair clips,

FOOD BANK DONATIONS

We need your help to keep our pantry stocked. If no family, or individual has made a special request; then, Lula pulls items off the shelves and takes them to the Cherokee County Food Bank, Inc. in Andrews, NC. The food bank is open to the public on Tuesdays and Saturdays from 10-12.

Suggested items based on Lula's previous discussion with some of the female staffs: they can always use feminine hygiene products and other personal hygiene items, e.g. toothpaste, toothbrushes, small bottles of mouthwash, bars of soap, wipes, small bottles of shampoo, soups that can be heated over a small fire, small jars of peanut butter and items that do not require a stove for cooking. Most of the clients are homeless and/or senior citizens living on a fixed income, so they can use small bottles of laundry detergent and Clorox to wash their clothes. Lula also includes assorted chips crackers to give to the homeless who sit outside next to the food bank. The food bank has a bakery that donates bread, and the local Walmart provides fresh produce.

You can also write a check payable to the Andrews Food Bank, P. O. Box 843, Andrews, NC 28901, and they will supplement items that are not being donated.

To whom much is given, much will be required (Luke 12:48). If you have heard that line of wisdom, you know it means we are held responsible for what we have. If we have been blessed with talents, wealth, knowledge, time, and the like, it is expected that we benefit others.

replaced. Several of the men assisted in the removal of the damaged flooring. The damage is covered under the insurance policy. We anticipated the replacement would take about a month.

Dean Wray can use our help to move items and with any last-minute details to help complete all projects. He is currently looking at carpet samples so if you want to help, PLEASE let him know.

Every WOMAN IN THE BIBLE

Every chapter in the book discuss both named and unnamed women of the Bible. The following entries indicate where the women are mentioned in the

Bible, and where they are discussed in the Bible.

This week we will start with V and finish with Z.

VASHTI [Vash tie: "beautiful woman"]. The queen of Persia about 425 B.C. When she refused to appear at a banquet the king held, he divorced Vashti and found anoth queen. The woman finally selected was Esther, who saved the Jewish people residing in the Persian Empire. See the book of Esther.

ZERESH [ZEE resh: "gold"]. The wife of Hamaan, the enemy of the Jewish people in 425 B.C. Zeresh suggessted that her husband build a gallows on which to execute the Jew Mordecai. In the end. Hamaan himself died on those gallows. See Esther 5:10, 14; 6:13.

ZERUIAH [zeh roo EYE ah: meaning unknow]. This sister of David was the mother of several commanders in David's army. See I Samuel 26:6; I Chronicles 2:16.

ZILLAH [ZIHL lah: "shadow protection"]. She is named in early Genesis as one of the two wives of Lamech. See Genesis 4: 19-23.

ZILPAH [ZILL pah: meaning unknown]. Leah's slave in 1925 B.C. Leah used Zilpah as a surrogate in a competition with her sister Rachel to give their husban Jacob the most sons. See Genesis 30.

ZIPPORAH [zip POE rah: "bird"]. In 1475 B.C., the wife of Moses. A Midianite, Zipporah bore toow sons,

Gershom and Eleazer. See Exodus 2:21, 22; 18: 1-6.
