- 3. There have been a few mold and air quality related issues at East School lately. Thank you to Mr. DeVito for attempting to resolve these issues as quickly as possible. We hope that the testing comes back better this time. In addition, we are hoping that some of the underlying issues that are causing many of the problems will be dealt with. We are looking forward to hearing more answers and solutions to the problems occurring there. In addition, we would like to make sure that these areas are monitored closely until we can get a better handle on how this will be addressed more permanently.
- 4. The temperature issues continue to be a problem, especially at the HS, MS and East. We are hoping to sit down and discuss some specific rooms so that we can try to figure out why the system is not recognizing these problem areas. It has been explained that the thermostats appear to be working, when you look at the sensors and temperatures, However, the readings in the rooms are extreme at times, and do not trigger the proper response. It is very frustrating and difficult to dress accordingly, for both students and staff, as the same room can be extremely cold or hot. This is distracting for all parties involved, and sometimes makes teaching and learning very difficult. We are still wondering why all rooms do not have a working thermostat and hope that can be addressed.
- 5. Mr. DeVito presented a third 2022-23 capital plan option, which has roughly the same cost as option #2 and includes a new item at LBHS. The details of this plan are posted on the LB website and will be discussed at the next Health & Safety Meeting.


