

# WKS One Act Team Performs Rappaccini's Daughter

Nathaniel Hawthorne's *Rappaccini's Daughter*, adapted by Christopher P. Nichols, will grace the William Kelley Stage on Wednesday, January 24 and Thursday, February 1 at 7:00 p.m. As the school's One Act Team performs this 35-minute adaptation of the early American short story, you might laugh, cry, and perhaps question the deeper questions of science.

The story begins in the 1840s with Giovanni, a young scholar who has just moved to Padua, Italy to dig into his studies at the university. It does not take Giovanni long to discover an incredible garden next to his lodging and, in that garden, a beautiful girl - Beatrice. Beatrice is daughter to Dr. Rappaccini, the curator of that incredible garden. The scene feels fairytale-like as Giovanni and Beatrice make eye contact through the flowers and a budding romance begins.

Like all good stories, however, things are not always as they seem. There are secrets in the garden - dangerous secrets. Dr. Rappaccini has challenged the lengths of science to develop the garden and, in the process, toed the line between creating marvels and playing God. While the victims of the story become obvious, the audience is left to

determine the true villain of the story as the play ends.

The One Act Team will perform in Silver Bay on January 24 before their first competition (Saturday, January 27) in Two Harbors. At competition, the students will have exactly 10 minutes to set up for the play and exactly 35 minutes to complete the play - even a second over will result in disqualification. At competition, students will get feedback from judges on successes and ways to improve. If the students rank in the top two plays of the day, they will continue on to Section Competitions on Saturday, February 3. Help them prepare for competition with a hometown crowd on January 24 and see how they improve on February 1; both shows are at 7:00 p.m. in the WKS Auditorium.

As an added bonus, the French Club is sponsoring a Chili Dinner feed on Thursday, February 1 from 4:15-6:15 in the WKS cafeteria. Come to William Kelley for dinner and stay for the show. Think of it as a dinner theater kind of experience.

Admission to the play is free. There will also be a bake sale to benefit the program. Free will donations will also be accepted.
