
The remainder of the newsletter will consist of "fixed" content, that doesn't change often, with the exception of the calendar, which is updated monthly.

We flew into Sacramento and drove out to Half Moon Bay south of San Francisco to start our trip. Half Moon Bay was a nice little Victorian resort area which looked like it got a lot of traffic from San Francisco for the State Beaches in the area.



Fantastic brunch and Pastries for later. The Old stage road to Pescadero was tight, and twisty and quite the adventure.

On to Monterey. Walked the Marina Pier and Cannery Row. Reminded me of one big Mall. Interesting shops though. Got a nice little place to stay called Andril Fireplace Cottages not too far from the beach and the 17 mile Road to Pebble Beach. 17 mile road through Pebble beach has an entrance fee, but was worth it. Nice drive along the coast and the Cypress trees with great views of the coast. Nice looking houses and golf course too.

The Hurst Castle in San Simeon. Unbelievable house with spectacular pieces of art dating back to Roman and Egyptian times. Pictures can not capture it.





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Indoor basement pool at the Hurst Castle. If it looks like gold leaf on the floor and pool tiles, it is.
