## Tr\&IL DUSTERS - WOW

 60 Years Young!!!It all began with a few hardy firemen and their wives who decided they wanted to learn to square dance. They found a caller, Art Steiner, and started the club which initially was named Chicks \& Chaps. In June 1958 the first newsletter went out with a contest to rename the club - Trail Dusters was the winning submission and has been our club's name since then.
For almost a decade the club prospered. But, in mid-1968 Art Steiner retired. and the club, very low on funds, became a traveling club. Many members dropped out
and by May 1969 the few remaining members felt that the club was slowly coming apart! Several members called a club meeting and over dinner made the determination to rebuild the club, unite the membership and elect new officers and a new board.
That decision resulted in the club slowly building the membership. At its most successful had over 500 members, making it the largest club in the country. Over the last decade, interest in square dancing has been waning. Our club, with its long history of both good and bad times has been lucky to have had, and currently do have, at the helm people who care about the club and have worked hard for its continuing success.
Our club was founded not only on the desire to learn to dance, but also from a feeling of community responsibility - which is no surprise given that the founders were already caring for the people of our community as Firemen! We were recognized as being the first club in the valley to make Christmas baskets and distribute them throughout the area. We carry on that tradition each year with a successful annual Drive for Ronald McDonald House in November.

As a Club we have much to celebrate at our $60^{\text {th }}$ Anniversary Dance in April.

## coordimotirs corner

As of this edition of the Dusty Trails, our Rail Duster class consists of two couples, six women, and five men. Arlen has finished teaching the Mainstream program and is now beginning to teach the Plus program. To help the Rail Dusters get all of the calls down solidly, we are holding a workshop on February 25th. Arlen has graciously offered to lead the workshop and Ellen \& llan Paz, one of our Rail Duster couples, have generously offered to host the workshop in their home. We are also encouraging the Rail Dusters and Angels in Training to attend our class level Dance on March $10^{\text {th }}$ - see flier page 11.

In February, as the calls became more difficult and the pace stepped up, it became clear that we needed to make some radical changes in order for our class members to successfully complete the 2017-18 year. We saw too much confusion when Arlen called the squares to form up. Once the music and calls began, many squares broke down because they were poorly balanced with too many weak or strong angels in some squares and/or too many strong or weak Rail Dusters in others. Some people were habitually in the front of the room while others were habitually in the back. Our solution has been to assign particular dancers to specific squares and to place the squares in specific positions on the dance floor. Each week we try to improve our Angel/Rail Duster Pairings and move dancers to different positions around the room. This has not always worked out the way we have planned due to unexpected absences or other factors but we are perfecting our plan little by little and it appears to be
helping. Feedback from the Rail Dusters has been positive and we see them learning the calls more solidly.
In the coming weeks, we will be contacting you so that we will have an idea of who to expect at class and we will encourage those of you who are advanced dancers to come out and help us. We are well aware that we cannot please all of you but want to stress how much we appreciate the Club's support and patience as we strive to have a class that should be able and willing to attend our dances after graduation in June.
