Admiral Heights Improvement Association Board's GoToMeeting hosted by Scott Gibson on Sept. 3, 2020

Called to order: 8 p.m. by President Scott Gibson

Survey: Flasher will conduct a survey to determine what the association's priorities should be. The responses to this survey may be used to craft the next budget. The survey should be short with only a few questions. The survey should be conducted yearly to reflect changes in the community. The survey might include traffic, crime, racks, docks and events.

Distribution: What is the best way to reach residents? Flyers, mailouts, online (Facebook and website), email and newsletters were discussed. It was noted that some seniors may not have access to the technology and/or the know-how to use it.

October meeting: Germantown Elementary School and the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium will both be unavailable as meeting spots. McGinnis volunteered to set up a webinar-style meeting. Residents will be able to click on a link or dial in.

Weeding: Coelho was praised for all the weeding she's done in the Sampson-Porter Circle.

Improvements: Board members talked about possible community improvements, including sidewalks and an indoor place for children to play. Residents were urged to share their ideas and to find people to champion the ideas.

Traffic: Money for sidewalks is in the Capital Improvement Budget.

Can the speed limit be lowered? Traffic engineers have conducted a survey. The average speed driven in Admiral Heights is 23 mph. They concluded that people drive as fast as they can safely drive.

It was noted that 25 mph seems fast, but it's not speeding. With all the walkers, runners and children out and about, the speed limit seems high. Speed bumps, speed cameras, and narrow, winding and curvy roads were discussed.

Minutes: August minutes were approved.

Treasurers Report: Nothing has changed. The post office box needs to be checked.

Kayak racks: Flasher & Garcia have installed the posts. They just need to put in the 2 x 4s.

Light at Dewey Dock: A repair person was scheduled to be there today.
