

# Smalls Ragwort



Packera are a larval host for 18 species of butterflies and moths. They are also an important food source for pollinators. This Ragwort performs well in dry, clay soils in full sun. The leaves are semi-evergreen and deer and other herbivores avoid it. The flowers are small, but numerous and fit nicely in a dry meadow or when massed.

## *Packera anonyma*

- Hardiness: Zone 3-8
- Size: 1-2'. Forms colonies
- Flower: Yellow flowers in April and May
- Culture: Sun to part Shade and Dry to Average soils
- Uses: Groundcover, Naturalizing, massing, rock garden, deer resistant, drought tolerant, showy, pollinators, butterflies, birds, cut flower
