

During the next 3-4 weeks, we will be inundated with all things "Christmasy". Many of us will rush out to as many stores as we can fit into our days; looking for that special gift that someone said they wanted for Christmas. Many of us have already begun to move furniture to make room for an especially large tree; every ornament and decorative pieces must be perfect. The closer December 25 gets, there will be nothing but RUSH, RUSH, RUSH, However, our scriptures during this season of Advent are telling us to slow down and re-examine our lives with Christ Jesus.

Advent is the time to do that; it's the time "to come". This, the 1st Sunday of Advent, begins a new liturgical calendar. We also begin preparing for the coming of Jesus Christ. We will light candles, sing Advent hymns, and we will wait and prepare of hearts to receive Him. The season will take us back to simpler times without all the frantic pace that has become the signature for our lives today.

We will celebrate how Jesus comes to us in three ways: (1) How He came to us, over 2000 years ago; there will be re-enactments, pageants and cards; (2) How Jesus comes among us now, in God's Word and the Holy Eucharist, and how He comes to us in one another; (3) We celebrate His Second coming when He will judge creation. bringing in a time of peace and joy that is spoken of so eloquently in the Isaiah reading for today. The end is coming, to be certain....but when? We must understand that this life is like a race, not a "rat race", but a Christian race. We are not competing against each other; we are competing against evil obstacles - physical and spiritual. Jesus continues to warn us and remind us to Always Be Ready. In today's gospel He tells us that the Son of Man will come Secretly - Selectively -Surprisingly. He wants us to be doing what is right and just at **all** times. Let us always walk in the Light of the Lord.....Let us go rejoicing to the House of the Lord. PAY ATTENTION!! KEEP WATCH!! BE READY!!

In a simple term, advent means "coming." The term is rooted in the Greek word, Parousia, which is used to refer to the second coming of Christ. Advent points to two ideas of "coming" in relation to Christ: The coming of the baby Jesus at Christmas and the second coming of Christ at the end of time.
