

North Shore Culinary Classes Begin January 2019 in Grand Marais, Minnesota

North Shore Culinary - Hibbing Community College (NSC-HCC), will offer Culinary Arts Certification and a Culinary Arts Diploma designed to empower students to achieve their full potential in the culinary arts field. North Shore Culinary focuses on small class sizes and individualized instruction that allows students to acquire the skills, confidence and professional cooking credentials they will need to launch or advance their career path. Graduates enter the workforce with a balance of practical skills, respect for local resources, sustainable practices, operational awareness, work experience, personal mindfulness, focus and dependability that they will need to work with competence and succeed in a vast range of food service venues including five star restaurants, food trucks, resorts, private catering, cruise liners and bakeries.

The North Shore, bounded by Lake Superior, Canada and the BWCAW, has an energetic vibe that combines community spirit with the amazing history of the Grand Portage Band of Lake Superior Chippewa, a vibrant arts scene, live music and natural beauty. Cook County has more than 50 establishments serving great food to both visitors and local clientele.

Cook County Higher Education (CCHE) Program Coordinator Kelsey Kennedy, "Formal Culinary Training was identified as a need to address the employment challenges throughout Cook County's Tourism Industry. The creation of the school will not only allow interested Cook County residents the opportunity to remain in the area while pursuing culinary education, but will attract new residents to the North Shore and address employers' need for skilled staff."

The opportunities afforded to the students in the North Shore Culinary program will include an *Earn While You Learn* aspect that makes this program unique. CCHE will be able to connect each student to a paid culinary job part time during the

school year and full time during the summer months. Students will work and learn side by side with chefs in many of Cook County's world class kitchens, helping to cover tuition costs for each participant while attending NSC-HCC. Classes will be held 7 1/2 hours a day, Monday - Thursday, in the brand new, state-of-the-art culinary classroom at Cook County High School.

In addition, Cook County Higher Education has developed optional programming for North Shore Culinary Students that will enrich a students time while in culinary school. The bonus programming will help students build resumes, provide guidance on future employment options and develop business knowledge, leadership abilities and healthy living skills.

Local Author's New Book Reveals Little-Known Grand Marais History

Local author Tim Cochrane has released a new book, *Gichi Bitobig, Grand Marais - Early Accounts of the Anishinaabeg and the North Shore Fur Trade*.

Using accounts pulled from the journals of American Fur Company clerks, the book delves into the complex history of the early days of European settlement near Grand Marais and the Anishinaabeg people who traded with them.

Set between 1823 and 1825, this fascinating account sheds light on a little-known time in North Shore history. Cochrane

skillfully recreates the interaction between fur traders from the American Fur Company as they attempt to compete with the Hudson Bay Company and form critical relationships with the Anishinaabeg people of Gichi Bitobig in what is now Grand Marais.

Gichi Bitobig, Grand Marais reveals the keen trading tactics of the Anishinaabeg people who sought to play the two fur trading companies against one another for their own benefit. Using the words of the two American Fur Company clerks, and pulling details from other largely un-

known documents from the time, Cochrane allows readers a glimpse into an important moment in our local history.

Tim Cochrane has worked as a superintendent for the National Park Service in Alaska, Michigan, and Minnesota - most recently at Grand Portage National Monument where he worked extensively with the Grand Portage Band of the Lake Superior Chippewa. He has also worked as a

backcountry ranger, anthropologist, and historian. He is the author of two other books: *A Good Boat Speaks for Itself and Minong - The Good Place: Ojibwe and Isle Royale*.

Cochrane will hold a book signing and reading event for *Gichi Bitobig, Grand Marais* at Drury Lane Books located at 12 E Wisconsin St. in Grand Marais. The event will take place on Saturday, December 1st from 5 to 6pm. You can find more information by calling 218.387.3370.
