

Trumpet Honeysuckle



This native vine will attract flocks of hummingbirds to your yard. It is also an important nectar source for bees and butterflies. Honey-suckle is a larval host to the Spring Azure and Snowberry Clearwing Moth. The fruits attract quail, Purple Finch, Goldfinch, Hermit Thrush and American Robins. This plant has also been used traditionally for medicinal purposes.

Lonicera Sempervirens

- Hardiness: Zone 4-9
- Size: 10-20', depending on structure
- Flower: Orange-red or red in late spring and early summer. Re-blooms sporadically throughout the season
- Culture: Prefers full sun and a moist well drained soil. Tolerates shade but does not flower as profusely
- Uses: Great twining vine, arbors, important hummingbird species, bees, butterflies, birds, medicinal
