### REMEMBER YOUR BAPTISM

Do you remember your baptism? I don't. I was only three months old when I was baptized. How am I supposed to remember my baptism?

I was the third child, so I never saw any pictures of my baptism. Mom told me that my father bought a new suit for the occasion. While they were waiting in the hallway to be called into the Sanctuary, she said I threw up all over his brandnew suit. After that story, I'm not sure I want to remember my baptism!

I've always been intrigued by Jesus' baptism. Something drew him to the Jordan River around the age of thirty. He must have studied John for several days before presenting himself for baptism. He didn't need to be baptized. Being without sin, there was no need for Jesus to repent and wash away his sin. Why did Jesus ask to be baptized?

Recognizing Jesus, John resisted at first, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" (Matthew 3:14). But John consented when Jesus said, "Let it be so for now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness" (Matthew 3:15). So, beyond repentance of sin, this tells me that baptism is about belonging—belonging to God and to God's people, and belonging to the way God thinks and acts. Jesus asked to be baptized so he could belong. Like Will D. Campbell says, "When one is baptized, it's like moving into the neighborhood."

Though I don't remember my baptism, I do remember my confirmation. That was the day I decided to move into God's neighborhood and live God's righteousness: loving others in the same way that I love myself. I remember kneeling on the cold flagstone steps on Maundy Thursday, at age 13, with the elders pressing their hands on my shoulders. Even though I didn't know that much about the Bible, I did realize that I belonged. Like Jesus coming out of the water, I knew that God loved me.

Fifty years later I had the good fortune of meeting the pastor who baptized me in 1954. He was 95 years-old by then. Though he could not remember my baptism specifically, he remembered me and my parents and gave me a blessing. He reminded me that baptism is a sign and a seal of God's covenant grace in my life, and it's that covenant community that sustains us and gives us strength to live God's righteousness. That's why Jesus was baptized: to be engrafted into God's community for his life ahead.

On January 21, Janet Schreiner, a friend of Kathy Bateman, wants to be baptized. Her older siblings were baptized in a Presbyterian Church near Syracuse, NY, but for some reason, she was not. She lives the Christian life, and seeks a place to belong. She appreciates the welcome you have given her and the Spirit she has felt in our congregation. After she is baptized, I will introduce her, then charge you to "Remember your baptism, and be thankful." I hope you will be thinking about your baptism between now and then, live in God's love, and give thanks for your place in God's blessed neighborhood!

Committees all reported on their activities. Highlights included:


- The trip to Haiti will not happen in March, but plans are still being made.
