Dear Friends,

Dawn and I absolutely love serving here at St. John's. The foremost reason is your encouragement and love. Your warm reception of us has made it very easy to love you. A second reason is the many opportunities which exist here for Gospel-centered mission. I am excited about our new Sunday school, the possibilities for a puppet ministry, and our discussions about how we may bless the Beloit community. I am also very excited about our partnership with Cristo Para Todas Las Naciones (CPTLN).

We have only been a part of CPTLN for a couple of months and already we are moving forward with developing an outreach here at St. John's to welcome and share the good news of Jesus with our Spanish-speaking neighbors. Pastor Germán Novelli Machado, director of CPTLN, is committing a significant amount of his time to St. John's for the coming year. He and I have visited a number of Hispanic businesses in Beloit, and through his conversations with merchants and customers he has begun to establish contacts with our Hispanic neighbors. We also attended the Latino Community Fair (held at Beloit Memorial High) together. This event was a real opportunity for Pastor Novelli to meet people. St. John's Lutheran Church—Iglesia Luterana San Juan will have a booth at their next event in order to let people know what we have to offer.

On Saturday, November 19, from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm, Pastor Novelli and other members of CPTLN will be offering a workshop here at St. John's on Hispanic ministry. This is an event that I am asking all of our members to attend. I rarely make such requests of my congregations—but this event is vital for our congregation. We will be having a potluck luncheon from Noon to 1 pm that day, and so we are asking members to bring a covered dish to share. More details about the meal will be announced in the service bulletins. Please mark this date on your calendar and join us for what could be a real turning-point for our congregation.

On Saturday, March 4, from 1:00 to 5:00 pm, we will be offering a free workshop for our Hispanic neighbors

to attend. This event will consist of four break-out sessions that will rotate every 40 minutes so that everyone who attends can participate in each station. The four presentations are: Legal Issues, led by an attorney specializing in immigration law; Health Issues, let by a physician; Marriage Issues, led by a Spanish-speaking pastor, and Who Are St. John's, led by Pastor Novelli and me. This will be a wonderful opportunity to connect with our Hispanic neighbors and talk with them about what St. John's has to offer.

On Friday, April 14, beginning at 6:30 pm, Pastor Novelli and I will be offering a Good Friday service in Spanish.

On Sunday, April 16, beginning at 6:30 pm, Pastor Novelli and I will be offering an Easter service in Spanish.

We are also hoping to host some type of Christian day camp at St. John's for Spanish-speaking families in the community.

While we are doing a lot of work on this, if any fruit is to come from our labors it will be by the Holy Spirit working through the Gospel, and so I invite your prayers for this important mission. It is also important for me to emphasize that this is only one part of our strategy for renewing our congregation. There is also much work to be done in reaching out to our Englishspeaking neighbors, as well. We are still very interested in hosting a director of Christian outreach intern when the funds become available. Birthdays



We all know what waiting is like. Parents waiting for children out past curfew know it. Couples having trouble conceiving a child know it. A family separated by overseas military service knows it. A person needing an organ transplant knows it. A candidate for law or medical school knows it. A pregnant mom 10 days past due knows it. A person struggling to be hired for a job knows it. In fact, at one time or another, most of us come to know this brooding beast. It's the long wait -- that drawn out time of fretful anticipation and extended longing.

None of us like to wait. We like to think that those with power and position don't have to wait like we do. "They" get to move to the head of the line. "They" get to throw around their weight and get what they want when they want it. But, that isn't true, we all have to wait.

The Waiting

"but they who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint." (Isaiah 40:31 ESV)

"Those who wait upon the Lord will renew their strength..."

Often, this is easier said than done. Before we get to "mount up on wings like eagles," we often have to obediently grind away through the brutal passage of agonizing time. Before we can "run and not grow weary," we have to trudge on as anticipation dims and hope's flickering flame fights against the winds of despair. Many times, we just have to keep walking and trust that some hidden grace will help us "not faint."

This is a reminder that Jesus is there for those who wait. It is a renewal of the ancient hope that God will act for those who don't give up during the long wait. You see, the issue isn't the wait. Instead, it is all about refusing to give up hope when the journey seems so long.

Maybe you face the long wait right now. Maybe your heartbreak or shame or disappointment or loss seems insurmountable. If so, you are encouraged to remember the place where broken hearts meet, the place where broken dreams are mended, and the place the long wait ends. Know that place is really a person, and his name is Jesus.

Dear Friends,

I am absolutely delighted by the participation in our Sunday school program! We have classes for all ages and we encourage you to invite others to join us. The program is held every Sunday (unless otherwise indicated in the previous week's announcements) from 10:30 to 11:15 am.

1. Preschool/Kindergarten – the students and their parents/guardians/grownups meet in the nursery downstairs – where they are escorted by my wife, Dawn, to the Art Room where Randy Bauling will be waiting for them to lead them in crafts and skits. They begin with crafts and skits for the first 20 minutes, and then are led by me back to the nursery where they have 20 minutes of Bible learning with Lori Dotson and me.

2. Grades First through Sixth – the students meet with me in the Conference Room (across the hall from Lisa's office) for the first 20 minutes of Sunday school for Bible learning, and then I escort them to the Art Room for 20 minutes of crafts and skits.

3. Grades Seven through Twelve – the students meet with Christi Bickford in room 201 in the school building for their class. The curriculum engages the students in discussing how the Bible lessons speak to their daily lives. Concordia have provided YouTube videos to go along with the sessions, and so there is a multimedia component to the classes.

4. Adult Class – the adults will be meeting in the Fellowship Hall (downstairs) to study the same lesson that the other classes are looking at. Many thanks to Don Nohr and Jeff Vander Kooi for their willingness to lead the class.

In order to reinforce our learning and help all of our members grow in their engagement with the Bible, our Divine Service each week focuses upon the same lesson as that studied in Sunday school.
