Jeannie Harrington Palermo Dicks 1930-2016

Olatha Jean "Jeannie" Harrington Dicks, one of three co-founders of WAVES National, passed away on New Year's Eve. Born on 3 March 1934 in Harjo, Oklahoma, Jeannie joined the Naval Reserve on 2 September 1952 because she wanted to serve her country and loved the uniform. She attended Boot Camp in Bainbridge, Maryland. Promoted to Seaman Apprentice in November 1952, she married and subsequently became pregnant with her son Tommy. Because pregnancy was not authorized for military women at that time, by June 1953 she was discharged and moved to Sacramento, California.

Jeannie found work in the police department as a meter maid, proudly driving a 1945 Harley Davidson Service Motor-trike. She kept in touch with her Navy friends but missed being in the service with them. Collecting hundreds of names and phone numbers, she socialized routinely with as many as possible but, she said, "The only time we got to see our friends was births, deaths, and weddings." They wrote many letters and, according to Jeannie, everyone had an address book filled with contact information for friends.





About this time, Jeannie, who had divorced her first husband and was then married to Joe Palermo, and two of her friends, Ester Govorchin and Loda Mae Dobbins said, "Wouldn't it be nice to have a real organization where women could share stories, socialize, and take care of each other? We could have big get-togethers with everybody there and have a lot of fun while we see new places."

The three brainstormed the idea and took the steps necessary to develop a legitimate business entity that would be recognized officially as tax-exempt and non-profit, and afford opportunities for members to support each other. They specifically designed the organization to be social in nature and for the betterment of all its members. Jeannie said this became a passion for her, because she "loved the Navy so much, she couldn't get it out of her blood."

On 14 July 1979 Jeannie Palermo, Loda Mae Dobbins, and Esther Louise Govorchin became the first formal WAVES National Executive Board. The Articles of Agreement for the WAVES National Corporation were accepted by the State of California as a non-profit organization with these objectives: "to encourage patriotism, loyalty, and devotion to God, country and family; for each member to help one another and her community, state, and nation; and for each member to be of actual assistance; and to keep up each other's morale."

Funded in large part by Esther, they operated from a post office box in Sacramento, California, and organized the first WAVES National convention for 250 women with the theme as "Still Something Special." Today, the organization has morphed into Military Women Across the Nation (MILWOMEN) to include ALL women who served honorably in ALL military services in the United States.

Jeannie, whose husband Joe had passed away years earlier from cancer, married Ralph Dicks in the early 1990's and proceeded to dedicate her entire life to furthering the goals and supporting not only women but all members of all the military service branches.

She collected and provided countless Starbucks gift cards to Camp Pendleton, California, deploying Marines and Sailors and was known as "The Starbucks Lady." An avid quilter and past Worthy Matron of the Poinsettia Chapter of Oceanside, California Order of Eastern Star, Jeannie spearheaded a toy drive for Eastern Star to support the USMC Toys for Tots drive. She also quilted local projects and compiled pictures to construct a commemorative Women in the Navy quilt. (Continue Jeannie on page 3)



Jeannie attended numerous Women's History Month events in Southern California, encouraging young women - and men - in the military, and was particularly proud of her granddaughter Ruthie who joined the Marines. She represented WAVES National at the Beachjumpers reunion in Coronado, California, and represented Military Women in the 2011 New Year's Day Pasadena Rose Bowl Parade. Jeannie supported the Girl Scouts by teaching them to sew neck pillows for the MILWOMEN-USO Pillow Project at San Diego Lindbergh Field and giving them bow & arrow lessons for the archery merit badge.

Some of her many other accolades include: Being made an Honorary USS Benfold (DDG65) Sailor by Commander Michele Day, the ship's first female Commanding Officer; Recognized for her efforts supporting military women by U.S. Congresswoman Susan Davis (CA, 53rd District); and having San Diego City Councilwoman Donna Frye proclaim 11 September 2010 as "Jeannie Dicks Day" throughout San Diego, California.

Military Women Across the Nation College Scholarship Rules & Application

This \$1,000 scholarship is available to a relative - male or female - of a military woman.

The 2017 essay topic is "Military Women Around the World".

Applicants shall select a U.S. military service or branch such as aviation, medical, supply, etc. and compare the service of U.S. military women to the similar service of military women in at least one other country's military.

A few Ideas include, but are not limited to: Women on submarines – U.S. & Norway; Women fighter pilots – U.S. & United Arab Emirates; Universal Conscription/Draft – U.S. & Israel; Women on Surface Ships – U.S. & Japan, etc.

PLEASE FOLLOW THE RULES

Previous applicants have been disqualified simply because they did not follow the rules.

Applicant Eligibility

- 1. Applicants may be female or male but must be a civilian relative of a Military Woman who has served or is serving honorably in the U.S. Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force or Coast Guard or their Guard or Reserve components. The relationship may be by birth, legal adoption or marriage.
- 2. Applicants must have a 3.2 or better Grade Point Average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale.
- 3. Applicants must be a high school senior or undergraduate college student.
- 4. Entries must be submitted by March 3, 2017: NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 5. This scholarship is NOT for military women or veterans.

Application Package MUST INCLUDE the following:

- 1. Completed Application.
- 2. Copy of all transcripts pertaining to current course of study to include academic standing.
- 3. **Documented Proof of the military woman relative's honorable military service**. Application packages without this proof <u>WILL NOT be considered</u>. **Documented Proof** is a legible copy of the military woman's Standard Form DD-214 discharge certificate **OR** a Statement of Service on letterhead from an Active Serving military woman's command.

NOTE: To protect personal information applicants are directed to mark out all references to social security and/or service numbers on the DD-214 and high school or college transcripts.

- 4. An essay of 1,000 to 1,500 words in length written on the 2017 topic. The essay must be the applicants own work; be submitted in .doc or .docx format, and include documented evidence of both research and an interview with at least one military woman. (The interviewee does not need to be the qualifying relative.) Applicants are encouraged to contact military women in recruiting offices, at military bases, reserve units, etc. to enhance the research.
- 5. The entire Application Package shall be submitted in one email to include **separate attachments** for the following:
 - (1) Completed Application
 - (2) Transcripts (must be legible)
 - (3) Military Woman Relative Proof of Eligibility
 - (4) Applicant's essay (in .doc or .docx format)

Each attached file must include the applicant's last name and first initial as part of the file name and ALL correspondence must include the applicant's name in the subject line.










NEW ENGLAND MILITARY WOMEN
