

FROM THE DESK OF **FATHER PETER** ADOKO-ENCHILL...

HOW THE BEREAVED ARE **SUPPORTED**

In Ghana grief is experienced in so many ways--due to the loss of loved ones, destruction of properties or loss of job and wealth, rejection by the family or society, and in some ways, serious incapacitation due to accident.

I will center my reflection mostly on loss of a loved one, and the support experienced in Ghana. Before one can understand how the bereaved is or are supported, one has to understand a little bit about the cultural set up of the society. The culture is communitarian in nature. Whatever happens affects each and everyone in the society.

In Ghana, we have clans which are made up of families who trace their ancestry from one family tree. There are different clans and one becomes a member by birth. It is made up of extended families and nucleus families, or immediate family.

When a family member is sick immediate family members are notified. They are expected to pay a visit, and offer something if there is the need of it. One or two immediate members would be around to offer support in an way possible.

When one family member dies, each member of the clan is supposed to contribute for the funeral from the day he or she died to the time of final funeral rites. The very day one dies, immediate family members and some extended family members come to the house to console the husband or wife or parents or children left behind. Other people from the village or town would also be there to console the family.

From the time till the dead is buried, some very close family members would stay in the house to support the bereaved family. The widow or widower is not allowed to do certain family chores.

On the day of the burial, most people in the society would be present to support and mourn with the family. There will be donations in cash and in kind. After the burial, some immediate family members would stay for some time before going back to their various places. Those in the same town would come every morning to greet the bereaved and ask about their health. In olden days, some members of the family would stay for forty days before going to their homes finally. By then the one in grief might have overcome the shock. (To be continued next week.)

The Sacraments of Healing



We are very fortunate to have two great Marian Feasts to celebrate this week. The Feast of our Lady of Guadalupe and the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. Both are significant to those of us here in the Americas. Our Lady of Guadalupe has been designated the patroness of
