

Woman's Clubs Around the Nation

The Key West Woman's Club (Florida)

In November, Patricia Villarreal reached out to the Newsletter to share some photos of Woman's Clubs sent to her by member Dana Stone. When Dana was on a visit to her son who is a student at the College of Key West, she enjoyed finding the local Woman's Club. The Key West Woman's Club was founded in 1915 and the historic Hellings House and Museum, pictured on the left, has been their home since 1940. This 8,334 sq. ft. home built in 1892 is one of the few privately owned mansions remaining on the historic Duvall Street. Like the Woodward Mansion, Hellings House is beautifully decorated and maintained by her Club and is available to the public for special events. Their major annual fund raiser is the "Talk of the Town" Restaurant & Theater Tour Card with 29 restaurants and 3 theaters participating.

The Rockford Woman's Club (Illinois)

The Rockford Woman's Club came into being in 1897 when "13 independent women's groups dedicated to civic and cultural improvements and the intellectual growth of its members joined forces"¹. In 1918 these outstanding women opened The Rockford Woman's Club Building in downtown Rockford. "The building boasts spacious meeting rooms, beautiful banquet facilities and an <u>800-seat theatre</u>."¹ Over its history Ethel Barrymore, Amelia Earhart, Will Durant, Ogden Nash, Hal Holbrook, Dr. Joyce Brothers and Martha Stewart have been on the stage at The Rockford Theater. Scoop: This club has an antique bar to provide the full range of beverages during shows and events.

Before our January meeting, WCSA president, Jane Stone, visited with the president of the Woman's Club of Fort Worth about the challenges of operation during a pandemic. The Fort Worth club was formed in 1923 and added a Junior Woman's Club in 1926. The Junior Club itself has 12 focus groups (`a la Round Tables) with programs on wellness (physical, environmental, financial); cinema arts; culinary arts; decorative arts; professional development; and appreciation of books, speech and drama.

In February the Woman's Club of Fort Worth will team with Dillard's for a virtual event,

"A Most IncREDable Evening" with a style show and auction to benefit the Club's charities. In normal times the club can host events for parties of up to 400 and has an on-site catering service.

The Woman's Club of San Antonio

Our founding, in 1898, was inspired by some of the earliest Woman's Clubs. Our 15 charter members were pioneers for women's suffrage and the origination of PTA's for San Antonio schools. The club led the charge in raising funds to establish the San Antonio Art League and the Witte Museum. In 1926 the club purchased the 9,000 sq. ft. Woodward House and will celebrate a centennial at the house in only five years!

The San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo is a volunteer organization with a mission of supporting the development of the youth of Texas by emphasizing agriculture and education. Since 1984 over 223 million dollars in scholarships have been given to support the college and trade skill goals of more than 21,000 students. Scholarship applications are not limited to students participating in the Stock Application contests include skill-a-thons in agricultural Show. science, agricultural mechanics, public speaking, agricultural art, landscape design, nutrition and robotics. The Stock Show and Rodeo has been held at the AT&T Center since 2003 but this year it will take place in the Freeman Coliseum. The programs will include fourteen live rodeos and performances by local Texas music talent. COVID protocols will be followed.
