I joined Sons of Norway to learn more about Norway, the home of my grandparents. I became increasingly active in Fjellheim Lodge and held several offices over the years. I visited other lodges in Colorado and participated in many cultural events here and throughout the state.

I dutifully studied Norwegian history, geography and economics. I learned to make Norwegian dishes in the Fjellheim kitchen. We listened to Grieg and read Undset, Fossum, Ibsen, Nesbo and Hamsun in our book club.

Then I learned about Norwegian genealogy at another SoN lodge and studied digitalarkivet.no and bygeboks at length. I was able to trace my Norwegian ancestry back three centuries. Then I thought I should learn the language so I have been doing so at another SoN lodge.

All this came to a head last month when my wife and I visited Norway for the first time. I found myself more familiar with the cities and countryside than I expected. I could actually read some signs and menus. I knew where we were and where we were going. Maybe the studying was paying off.

Most important, the genealogy work put me in touch with my cousins in Fagernes. We talked about common relatives and families and what happened to everyone. We shared old pictures. We drank coffee together, twice. They took us to the farm where my grandmother was born, the farm my great grandfather worked and the church where my great grandmother was baptized 180 years ago. I was interviewed by a writer for the Viking magazine yesterday so I thought I would use those remarks for this article. 
There are prepaid packages with funeral homes but I like our plan because the family receives the death benefit directly to be used as they see fit. And the money is tax-free
