## July 19, 2016 Commission Meeting

The City of Cynthiana Board of Commissioners met in regular session July 19, 2016 at 5:30 P.M. in the Commissioner's Room at City Hall. Present were Mayor Smith, Commissioners Grayson, Mattmiller, Slade and Griggs, Attorney Lair was absent.

Mayor Smith called the meeting to order.

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Smith recognized Earl Litman with First Church of God to present the invocation.

Mayor Smith recognized Dwayne Florence with Cynthiana Harrison County Housing Assistance.

Mr. Florence is in attendance to ask the Commission for approval to park vehicles in the city lots in the Westside Redevelopment for a fund raiser during Walking Dead Day.

Other issues are rubbish and trash, cars and boats, furniture in yards and uninhabitable dwellings. Most issues are being resolved. The City has mowed 11 lots for Code Enforcement. Mr. Aldridge asked for the possibility of an informational brochure with highlights for citizens. It seems that most people are trying to fix what they are asked to fix. The vast majority of the people who don't cut their grass are renters.
